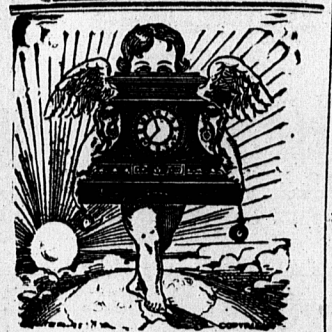

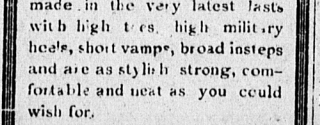

A woodstock, N. B., exchange says: Rev. J. K. Bearisto died suddenly at Glassville (N. B.), on Sunday morning, April 21, of heart failure. Mr. Bearisto was born at Malpeque (P. E. I.), July 5, 1840. He studied at Prince of Wales and Dalhousie Colleges, and also at Pine Hill and Princeton. His first charge was Salina, Kings county (N. B.), where he ministered for eight years. He was later for some three years at Carleton and Chebogue (N. S.). In 1884 he moved to Glassville where he ministered, with great success for twenty years. Retiring a few years ago he moved to Amherst where he lived until last February, when, with his wife, he returned to Glassville to live on a farm presented to him by Mr. Joiner, a warm friend and one of his former elders. Mr. Bearisto was twice married, first to Miss Patrick, of Macaan, and later to Miss Barnes, of Salina, who, with two sons and three daughters survives. As a minister Mr. Bearisto was greatly beloved. He was distinguished by modesty, charity and humility to a remarkable degree. He was zealous and faithful in the discharge of all his duties. His life was exemplary and he daily illustrated the gospel he preached. His funeral, which was conducted by Rev. M. H. Manuel and Rev. F. Baird, was very largely attended, the entire community assembling to mourn and show a last token of respect. After the interment, which was in the Glassville cemetery, the officers of the church assembled and decided to erect a suitable monument to their late pastor whose return to them recently had greatly rejoiced their hearts. Dr. Bearisto, a brother, as well as the sons and daughters of the deceased, though all absent from home, were able to reach Glassville for the funeral.

THE DEATH SHIP

(Continued from page 6.) away, nobody being buried this day. April 25th. Started at six a. m. and picked up 87 bodies, keeping all on board. Bodies searched and tagged in proper order. Heard that table-ship Minia was coming to relieve us. Minia arrived at midnight. April 26th. Started again at 6.15 a. m. picked up six bodies. Put boat to Minia for embalming fluid. Picked up 8 more bodies, then started for Halifax, having on board 190 bodies. We buried 160 bodies, having picked up 306 all told.

The first man to land from the "death ship" and interviewed immediately by representatives of The Mail was John Snow, Jr., who superintended the work of embalming the dead and generally directed the melancholy business of caring for the bodies as they were recovered from the ocean. His is a story to tear the heart.

"Our task," he said, "was entirely un-describable. It is impossible to give you any clear idea of its character." "Among the bodies we recovered is that of a two year old baby boy—he came floating to us with little up-turned face, the only body recovered who wore no life belt. Nothing I saw at sea made such an impression upon me."

"On last Monday we found 50 bodies all in a group, and nearby a life boat, which evidently had capsized, all within it being drowned. There was a red skirt found tied to a stick with which it is supposed that those in the boat had sought to attract attention, and failing, had gone down to their terrible death.

"We secured about 40 miles from the scene of the disaster, the bodies of twelve women. The reports state that there was an explosion and this probably explained the terrible mutilated condition of many of the bodies—arms and legs shattered, faces and bodies mangled.

"We picked up many lifebelts 170 miles from the wreck." "Many of the bodies picked up were of persons in full evening dress. And it is a remarkable fact that all the watches worn by the men stopped at precisely 10 minutes past 2 to the second. There was not the very slightest deviation.

"There was awful evidence of the fierce struggle for life, hands clutching wildly at clothing, faces distorted with terror. But it is no use to try to describe what we saw. To do so is impossible. As I said ours was a sickening task."

"There was a special service for each body buried at sea, 'Jesus, Lover of My Soul' being sung. "We found the 'black iceberg' which caused the wreck. It was an immense iceberg but badly shattered, and was photographed."

"We also picked up many life belts fully 170 miles from the scene of the disaster."

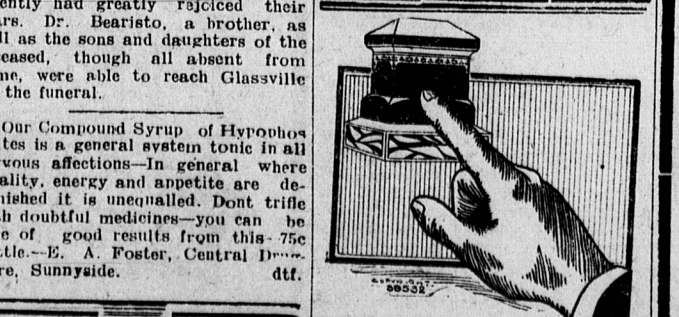

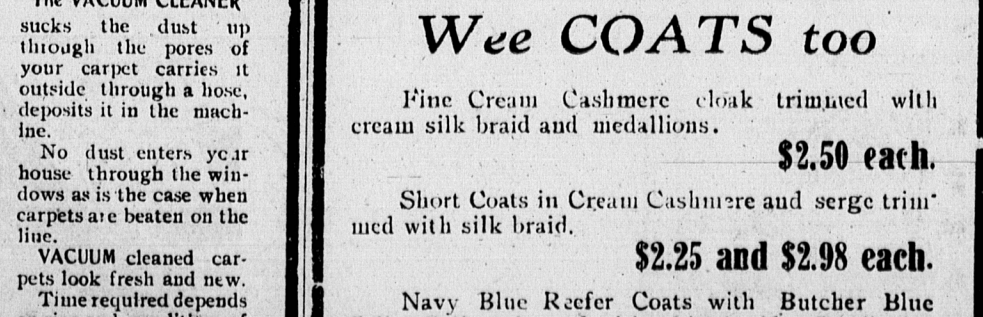

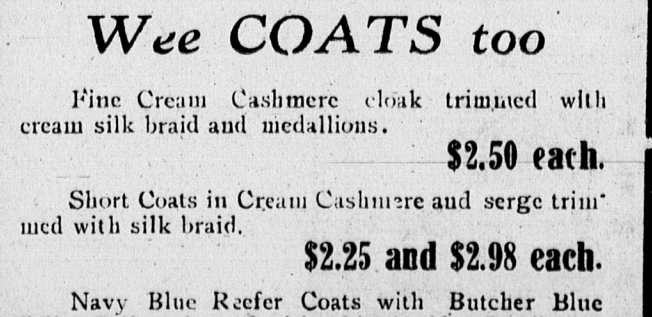
