

WILLIAM PARTRIDGE

The death of such a leading respectable citizen deserves more than a passing note.

Mr. Partridge attained the advanced age of 83 years, when his death took place at his home on the Covehead Road on the 6th October, and came as a shock to the community.

The deceased was in excellent health until about two weeks previous to his demise, and his many friends entertained hopes for his recovery, but a wise Providence ordered it otherwise. During his illness he was tenderly cared for by his beloved wife under the direction of Doctors McDonald and Jenkins.

Mr. Partridge was a man of strong conscientious convictions, sterling integrity, and was very popular, never compromising when principle was at stake.

He leaves to mourn his wife, nee Janie Mellett, a sister Mrs. John Henderson, of this city, and a brother Daniel Partridge in New Hampshire, U. S. A.

The funeral, which was a large and representative one, took place on Sabbath the 9th instant. Rev. F. E. Boothroy officiating. The Pallbearers were James Essery, Isaac Proud, Harry Henderson and W. B. Robertson, the funeral director being Mr. Neil McLean.
