The first meeting of the new Town Council will be held this evening. THE Y's intend giving a patriotic concert and supper in Montgomery's Hall at an early date, of which due notice will be given.

THERE will be a joint meeting of Mt. Lebanon and King Hiram A.F. & A.M. to receive an official visit from the grand lodge of P. E. I. Second degree will be conferred. A full attendance requested.

A grand meeting of the Summerside Board of Trade was held Friday evening in the Town Clerk's Office with the President Mr. B. C. McLeod in the chair. The Council acting on instructions received from the Board at a previous meeting, submitted a code of By-laws which on motion were adopted. The By-laws provided for an annual membership fee of \$2.50 for general quarterly meetings of the Board on the third Tuesday in January, April, July and October, and meetings of the Council on the first Thursday in every month. The Secretary's salary on motion of Mr. Wm. Stewart seconded by Mayor Campbell was fixed at \$50.00. The question of providing a room for the board was discussed, and was left for the Town Council to deal with at their next regular meeting. A discussion followed in reference to the need of the Port in transportation facilities and the secretary was instructed to open a correspondence on the matter. The secretary was also instructed to procure a seal and necessary stationery, and to ascertain the cost of printing By-laws and constitution.
