THE LATE SHAH'S DEBTS.

Our Special Correspondent in Teheran says that the question of the Shah's private debts, which consist of £300,000 due to the Russian Bank, incurred before his accession, and £100,000 due to other foreign and Persian creditors, may be settled by the Government's assuming these liabilities in consideration of the forfeiture to the State of all Mahomed Ali's immovable property in Persia. Under this arrangement, the Government would be prepared to increase his pension to approximately £18,000 but he is reported to be obdurate. The proposals of the Government are, however, regarded as reasonable, and doubtless the next step will be a warning to Mahomed Ali by the Legation that an obstructive attitude may result in terms less satisfactory to him than those now under discussion. There has just been found in the Treasury in Teheran gold coin to the value of £20,000.

Zil-es-Sultan is still kept in close detention at Resht, and persists in declining to contribute to the funds of the Government. He is to be removed to Rudbar, inland of Resht. Our Special Correspondent, describing the Nationalist occupation of Teheran which brought about the Shah's downfall, says:— The story of the extraordinary operation which resulted in the Nationalist forces passing through the Royalist lines and peacefully entering Teheran proves difficult of elucidation. That there was treachery at the Yusafabad gate admits of little doubt. I had personally seen seven of the gates less than three days before, and at each one a large guard was stationed. When the Nationalists entered, riding in close order as if there was no enemy within a hundred miles, there was not a soul to bar their entrance—so a European eye-witness informs me.—London Times.

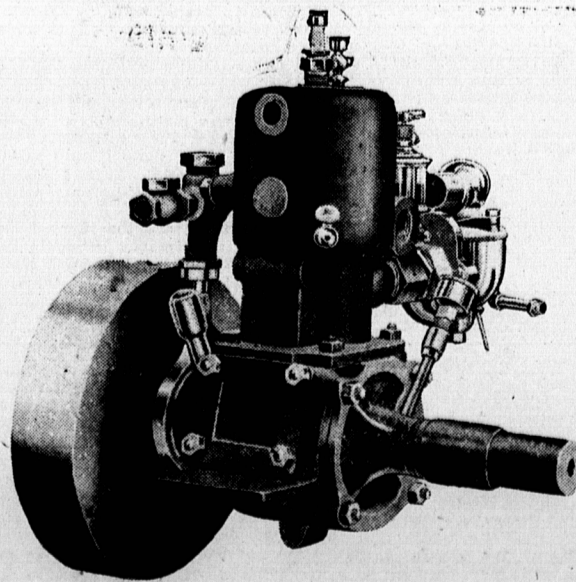

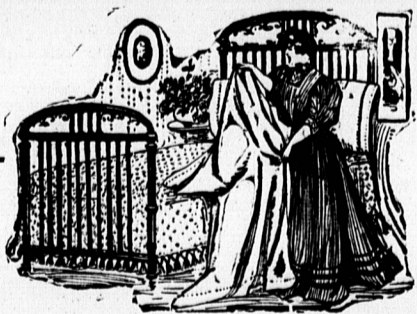
