Answer To Government Commission's Ad.

Dear Editor:-

In answer to the full-page ad. appearing in the papers, Wednesday, from the P.E.I. Temperance Commission, appointed by the Government to administer the New Law, we would reply that in the New Act (7c) the Commission is given power "to determine the towns within which Vendor's Stores shall be established throughout the Province" which means, of course, that without regard to the people's wishes the Commission can put a liquor store wherever they see fit and the Act gives no guarantee that they will not do this.

In Ontario in 1929 the Ferguson Government promised when they brought in the Control Act that the sale of liquor would be reduced and what happened? Sale went up and up through the Ferguson, (Lib.) Hepburn (Lib.), and

Drew (Cons.) Governments from 35 millions to 250 millions in the past year. In every province in Canada we have the same result, and if the New Act goes into force it will be the same story here, more and more out-lets all over the Province. The resistless pressure of the liquor interests is behind increasing sales.

No government has ever been able to control the sale of liquor as a beverage any more than they can control the motions of the earth. Gradually, but ultimately the Liquor Traffic controls the Government. Its very nature is to control. Therefore, to quote from the ad. already referred to, the suggestion (made by the Temperance Federation) that it (the New Act) "authorizes the opening of liquor stores" is not, at all "fantastic and devoid of truth." It is just

what we must expect from the New Act if it should go into effect.

People are asking who is the Temperance Commission? Do their opinions express the mind of the Government? We understood the Government went on record that they would not try to influence the vote one way or the other, but this full-page ad. makes a definite effort to sway people's minds in favour of the New Temperance Act.

And another thing, no one has ever claimed that Prohibition would completely prohibit. It never did in its best days, and it never will any more than law prohibits theft. We claim only that of the two systems of handling this vexed problem Prohibition is by far the better.
