

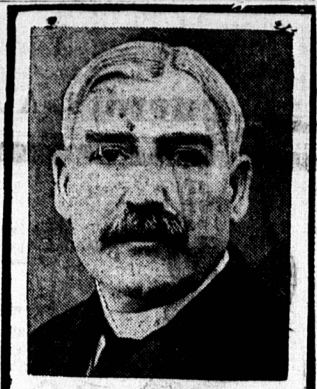

HEROIC ACT SAVES MANY LIVES.

TORONTO, May 26—An act of heroism is reported from Algonquin Park. Twenty sticks of dynamite were being thawed in cottages occupied by the sectionmen, their wives and children.

The fuse attached to one stick ignited. The men, with one exception, decamped, leaving the inmates of the cottage to run.

The women did not seem to understand, and one young sectionman, whose name was not learned, ran back, seized the smouldering stick and ran with it several paces and threw it from him. Just after it left his hand, it exploded with terrible force.

The young man was knocked down by the concussion, but was only stunned. His prompt act saved several lives.
