EXTENDING THE PHONE SERVICE.—The Telephone Company of Prince Edward Island are planning a large extension of the service throughout the island during the coming spring and summer. New lines will be installed from Eldon to Wood Islands; from Kensington to Malpeque; from Albany to Carleton, as well as lines running seven or eight miles, out of Alberton as far as the Mill River settlement. There will also be an additional toll line from Charlottetown to Hunter River. This will ease up considerably the pressure on the circuits from the City to Summerside. A similar line will be run from Charlottetown to New Haven, West River, Bonshaw, Argyle shore, DeSable, Kingston, Tryon, East Wiltshire, North River and York Point will be included in the new circuit. It is intended also to install another cable extension in the City to take care of the growing number of lines.

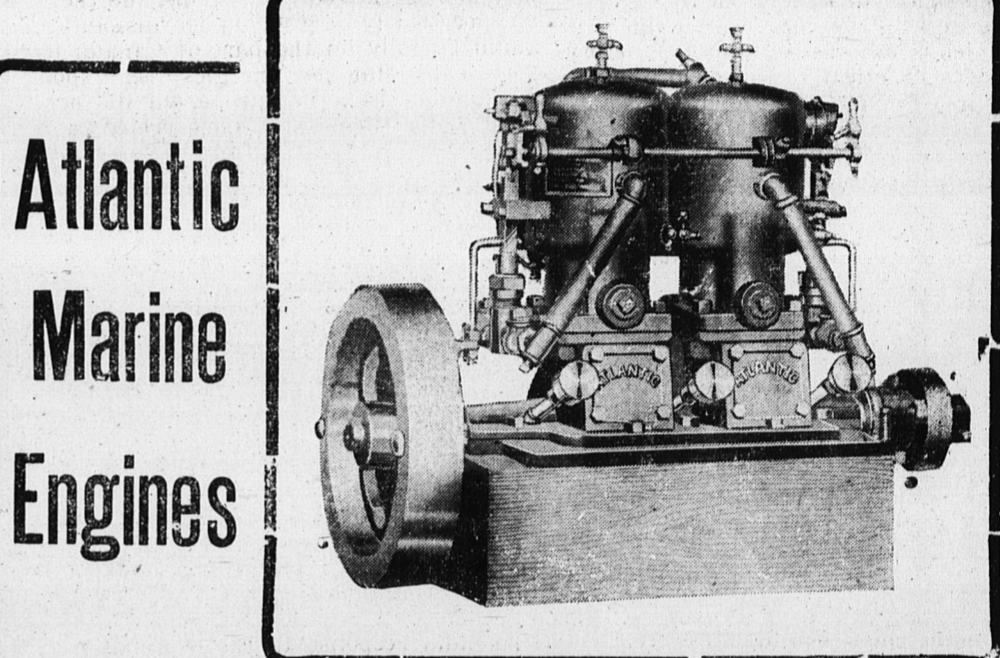
