### APPLE SHIPMENTS.

The Co-operative Fruit Company have received a cheque for Ben Davis apples shipped by them to England the latter part of February and also a letter from the company to whom they were sent, which reads as follows:

"We herewith beg to enclose you account sales and cheque for your apples of the 'Spartan' line. We regret to say most of the apples by this steamer came in a very unsatisfactory condition, but you will see by the high prices we obtained that you had fortunately not suffered. We should like to see a little more color in your apples. Of course we know it difficult you have to contend with in getting fruit across from P. E. Island to Halifax, but if you can get the apples over safely and free of frost, we feel sure we could make your mark well known on this market. Assuring you of our attention at all times.

The number of barrels of apples sent was sixty-one No. 1 Ben Davis and thirty-eight No. 2. The No. 1's realized \$3.85 and the No. 2's \$3.16 a barrel. One barrel of No. 1's was broken on the way and realized \$1.92. The expenses from Charlottetown to London were practically heavy, being \$1.43 per barrel. Had a cargo been shipped, this would have been lessened by about twenty cents per barrel. The returns, however, are very satisfactory and are likely to lead to much more attention being given to orchards in this Province. The cheques are being sent out by the company.
