Who Desire to SETTLE ON THE LAND

And receive assistance under THE SOLDIER SETTLEMENT ACT must first satisfy their district AGRICULTURAL QUALIFICATION COMMITTEE that they are qualified as "Settlers" within the meaning of the Act and receive a CERTIFICATE OF QUALIFICATION before they may enjoy the full provisions of the Act. Every returned soldier who expects THE SOLDIER SETTLEMENT BOARD to assist him in settling on the land should ascertain at once whether or not he is qualified. This applies also to all men who have already received an "Attestation" from the Board.

**Agricultural Training Courses**

Will be available for men who, while otherwise qualified, lack sufficient agricultural experience.
