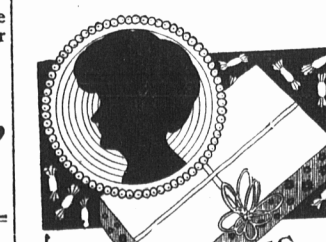

Eyestrains and Colds.

Dr. George M. Gould has, in the British Medical Journal, put forward a somewhat novel theory as to the cause of colds.

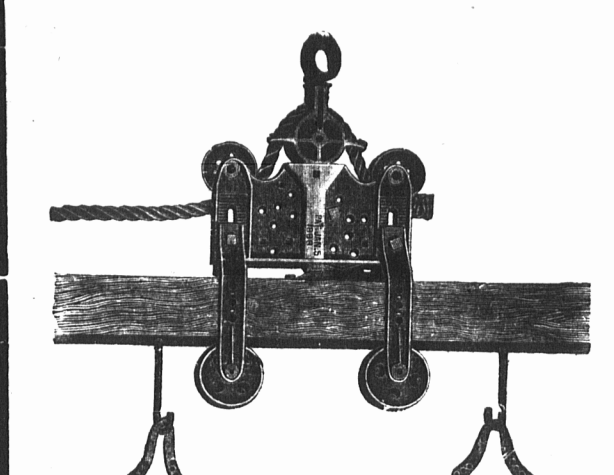
