HIGGINS IS DECLARED GUILTY

With Recommendation to Mercy for His Youth.

JUDGE LANDRY'S CHARGE

Sentence Deferred-Higgins Keeps Cool-Premier Murray and Steel Shipbuilding.

JUDGE LANDRY'S CHARGE

St. JOHN, Sept. 24.-[Special.]-Judge Landry this morning charged the Jury in the murder case.

He made a fair statement of the evidence but was against Higgins, although he expressed the view that Goodspeed was equally guilty.

JURY FINDS HIGGINS GUILTY. The Jury after two hours deliberation returned a verdict of "guilty" with a recommendation to mercy because of the lad's youth.

SENTENCE DEFERRED-HIGGINS COOL. The sentence was deferred till a later day. Higgins heard the verdict unmoved.
