In referring to the capture of the Salvage Corps race at the Firemen's Tournament the Halifax Recorder says:

THE SALVAGE CORPS RACE for teams of 16 men, also created great excitement. Although about a remarkably close contest, Halifax being defeated by Charlottetown by the 35 of a second, and both lowering the record of 1.007 made in 1896. Charlottetown ran first in 1.04 8-5 and Halifax followed in 1.05 1-3. Both teams ran splendidly, and Charlottetown earned their victory, but too much credit cannot be given the Halifax team for the great showing they made. Half of the visitors were athletes, several of them crack members of the Abegweit Crescent club, and entered in the Wanderers' sports, while of the Halifax team not one is a competitor in the games held hereabouts, and was simply a number of plucky young men, who make no particular pretensions of running, but who had trained faithfully and went in the contest to do their best. The showing they made against such opponents was certainly remarkable, and it was hard to be beaten by such a narrow margin, under such circumstances.

A SERIOUS electric car accident occurred at 10.50 o'clock yesterday morning at the entrance to the subway near what is known as "Dead Man's curve," opposite Church street, in the Public Garden, when an inbound Coolidge Corner car crashed into an Ashmont and Milton car which was just entering the underground passage. The injured are: Miss Sallie Shade, aged 22, 49 Stearns street, Waltham, very bad contusion of right side of head and right shoulder, contusion and abrasion of left elbow, contusion of the right hip. Miss Mary Cosgrove, 53 years of age, 5 Brunswick street Ashmont, very bad contusion of back and severe shock. Miss Gertrude Trainor, 5 Brunswick street, severe shock and injury to back. Unknown woman, Brookline, severely shaken up and wounded by large corsage pin sticking in her. Unknown woman, Brookline, contusion of side. Both cars were filled, and all of the passengers were more or less shaken up. Miss Cosgrove and her niece Miss Trainor, occupied one of the front seats on the Ashmont and Milton car. They knew nothing of the danger till they felt the shock, which threw them with great force against the seat in front of them. Miss Cosgrove received the attentions of Dr. Moore all day, and a late hour last night was resting as comfortably as could be expected, although she suffered a great deal from the injury to her back. The doctor, after a careful examination, however, was unable to find any fracture, and expects, unless further complications set in, that she will recover.—Boston Herald Aug. 6th
