Smashing Raid On Dusseldorf LONDON, Nov. 3 — (CP) — Allied bombers were over western Germany again today, the German radio reported, in the wake of a smashing assault on Dusseldorf, highly industrialized Ruhr city, by more than 1,000 R.A.F. and R.C.A.F. heavy bombers which dropped 4,000 tons of explosives on this armaments centre. The British-Canadian Halifaxes and Lancasters left "very large fires" burning at Dusseldorf last night, an air ministry communique said. Many enemy fighters were encountered and nine of the interceptors were destroyed. The onslaught on the Ruhr capital last night was the third successive heavy attack over Germany by moonlight. Strongest opposition over Dusseldorf came from big anti-aircraft guns that raked the city.
