MISSING SARNIA MERCHANT FOUND

SARNIA, Feb. 13.—Reported missing for the past two months, Stanley Williams, president of the now defunct chain of "cash and carry" stores here, has been apprehended by the United States immigration authorities in Washington, D.C., and tonight, accompanied by a secret service representative, he is heading toward the Imperial City, according to a message received by the authorities here. The message news received here is to the effect that Williams was arrested by the United States immigration authorities for illegally entering the United States. Chief of Police Forbes and Provincial Detective W. S. Stringer intimated tonight that a trio of charges await Williams here but they refused to discuss the nature of the offences. Mrs. Williams and three small children, it was stated tonight by a close friend of the family, are at present visiting relatives in Toronto.

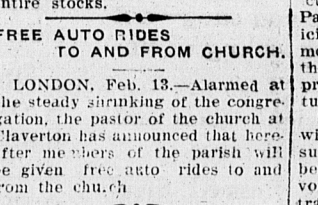
According to the United States immigration authorities the trail of Williams was picked up in Port Huron, and led to Detroit, from which city it zig-zagged to nearly every state in the Union. Letters led the authorities to Washington, and today the immigration officials acted upon that lead, Williams being taken into custody. He waived extradition rights, Williams departed from Sarnia just prior to the New Year, after he had completed chain of grocery stores in Lambton County. For a time the business seemed a most profitable one, but the sudden disappearance of the president brought facts to light that resulted in the closing of all the stores and selling out of the entire stocks.

RECORD LIST OF DIVORCE CASES.

OTTAWA, Feb. 14.—This year the Senate divorce bill will grind as never before. Although all the Provinces, with the exception of Quebec and Ontario now have divorce courts of their own, there are already 112 notices of intended applications for divorce presented and there are more to come. The formal petitions setting forth particulars cannot be presented until Parliament meets. Domestic infidelity seems to be especially common in Ontario, with Toronto as the storm centre. A very large proportion of the applicants are returned soldiers.

The question of divorce reform will probably be renewed as a result of this heavy docket. It has been proposed to abolish the divorce committee of the Senate, and transfer divorce to the jurisdiction of the provincial courts in all provinces. This would greatly lessen the cost of getting a divorce which at present may run into the thousands, if witnesses have to come from long distances. As all the expenses have to be borne by the petitioner, divorce is practically impossible for the poor man in the provinces where there are no divorce courts.

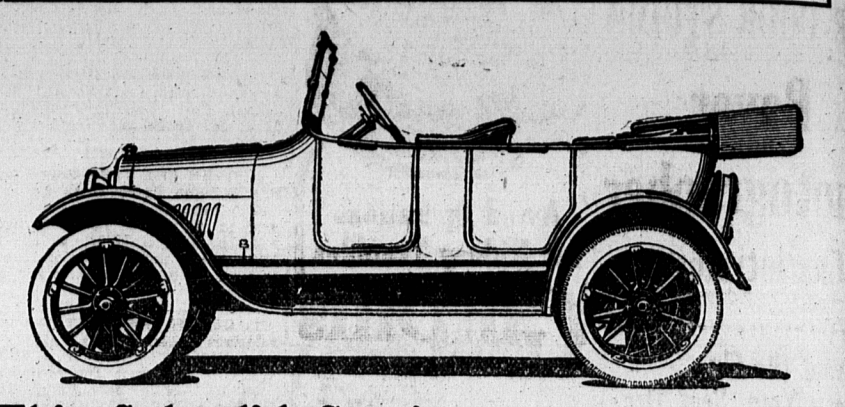

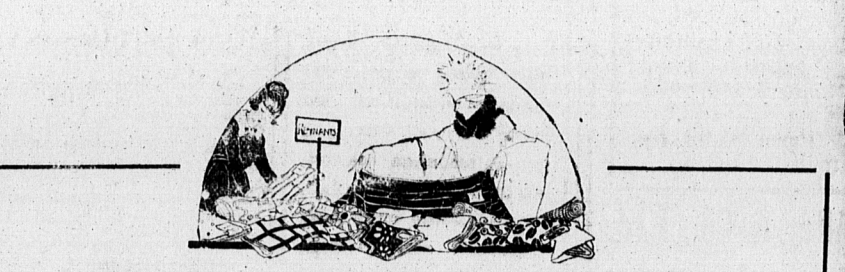
