Points To Ontario, As Good Example (Canadian Press) ST. CATHERINES, Ont., Oct. 11—At the 47th annual convention of the Ontario W. C. T. U. the members listened to Miss Anna Gordon of Evanston, Ill., the World's President of the W. C. T. U., who said the United States prohibitionists needed the inspiration of a victory in Ontario to hold their own over there. The treasurer reported a balance of \$6,000 which will be used as a publicity fund in the plebiscite, when 850,000 women may vote, Miss Maud McKee, of North Bay, of a committee which will meet the corresponding secretary, deplored a lack of co-operation of sympathy between the "Y. F." representing the young girls of the Union, and the older women, and expressed the view that the girls need disciplining.
