Cumiskey, at her home on Sunday morning, June 23rd, at the age of 86 years. The late Mrs. Cumiskey was the oldest resident of the district, and enjoyed a fair share of health, until a few weeks ago, when she became ill and despite all that could be done by her family and skilled physician, the patient's loving heart had ceased to beat, and her pure Christian life on earth was ended. During her illness she was consoled by the kindly visits of her pastor, Rev. Father Callaghan and other clergy, and received with great faith and piety, the last sacraments of the Holy Church, and the sweet example of her deep and fervent love of God will ever be remembered by all who knew her.
