HUNDREDS OF NAMES

STEAMER DISASTER

Hundred Drowned Near San Francisco

CONFUSION PREVAILED

Government Control of Railways—Wreckage Found Not the Lucerne's.

STRUCK A REEF AND SANK.

SAN FRANCISCO, Feb. 21.—(Special).—The steamer City of Rio Janeiro from the Orient and Honolulu struck a reef outside this city and sank in 20 minutes. A large number were drowned.

PARTICULARS OF THE DISASTER.

Only three boats got away. The Rio had 29 cabin and 150 steerage passengers and 140 crew.

Great confusion prevailed and many jumped overboard.

Consul Wildman and son are believed to have perished.

NOT THE LUCERNE'S WRECKAGE.
