BLUE NOSES.

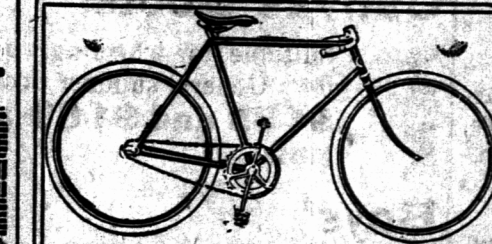
