LONDON—SPECIAL CABLE—May 12.—With the majority decreased by 420 votes in a greatly decreased poll, the Unionists to-day retained the constituency of Great Grimsby, Lincolnshire, in a by-election made necessary by the death of the former member, Sir George Doughty, P. G. Tickler, Unionist candidate, polled 8,471 votes.
