ST. JOHN, May 12—Hearing in pursuer of the steamer Empress of the case of Frederick Atherton, ex-Ireland, who is charged with forgery and also embezzling from the Dominion Express company, of which company he was the branch agent, out of the sum of \$2,000, was taken up in the police court Saturday. Evidence was given in the case went to show that while Atherton is merely charged with forgery and fraudulently obtaining \$2,000, the actual amount which he defrauded his employers out of was \$14,435.27. He was remanded to jail.

**A BIG CROWD WELCOMED J. BRUCE ISMAY.**

LIVERPOOL, May 11—A big crowd awaited the arrival of J. Bruce Ismay, managing director of the White Star line, on board the Adriatic, and cheered him as he walked down the gangway with his wife, who had gone on board at Queenstown and accompanied him here.

Mr. Ismay lifted his hat in acknowledgment of the reception, but excused himself from making any statement to the press, saying that he was still suffering from the strain of the disaster.

Mr. Ismay was pale and haggard and appeared much touched by his reception.

**BRAZILIAN NAVAL OFFICER DISMISSED.**

RIO JANEIRO, via Galveston, Texas, May 11—A decree was issued today dismissing the navy captain Costa Mendes, who was responsible for the bombardment of Manaus recently, when there was a serious conflict between opposing parties in the election of Governor of the State.

The trial of the others concerned will begin when witnesses arrive from Amazonas.

**HISTORICAL MONUMENTS WILL BE KEPT AT HOME.**

LONDON, May 12—The house of lords has taken effective measures to prevent the removal of further historical monuments to America.

A bill entitled "Ancient Monuments Production bill" gives the government the right of pre-emption for the purchase from a private owner of interest, which otherwise might be sold and sent out of the country.

**MAY OPERATE TRAINS BY WIRELESS.**

BUFFALO, May 11—Frank Wyatt Prentice, a Toronto electrical engineer, in an address last night before the Central Railway Club here, gave some details of experiments which he declares "demonstrate conclusively that electricity transmitted for power or commercial purposes by wireless, really increases in velocity and power the farther it goes from the point of origin."

Discussing the commercial use of wireless power, Mr. Prentice suggested that for automobiles and motor trucks, receiving harps be placed on at intervals along the roadway, energy being drawn thru the air to operate the machines. A flying machine, with a small high frequency motor, could, according to Mr. Prentice, fly at a height of 3,000 feet and draw sufficient power from a wave wire machine and wave-wires installed along the ground.

By a similar device it will be found possible, he believes, to operate trains at a great saving from the present cost.
