(Imp.) (491-1784)

Bay, blaze, hind legs white to hocks, toiled 1888 bred by Joseph Walcho, Thorney Lane, Newborough, Burton-on-Trent, Eng. and imported to October 1906 by John Chambers & Sons, Holdenby, Northampton England, owned by Hamilton and Hays, Prince, Ontario, and from whom were purchased. "Ranging Duke" is bred as follows:

"Ranging Duke" weighs 200 lbs., very massive built horse on short legs with very large bone and the best of feet and action. "Ranging Duke" has proved himself a first class stock horse before leaving England, as it can be seen he traces back to old William the Conqueror, the foundation of all shire horses. He won several prizes in the old country and Toronto in February of this year (1907) and won second prize in a drive field of horses. Everybody knows that a horse to win a prize at Toronto must be of the best quality.
