New York, Dec. 9.—A special cable to the Sun from London says—Miss Emily Hampton of Naseing was summoned yesterday for keeping a pig in a manner dangerous to health. 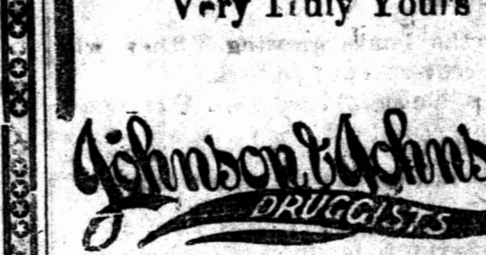
