In Memoriam

MRS. WILFRED PRAUGHT
MR. CHARLES E. MACDUFF

There passed away at his home in Brookfield on Sunday, October 13th, after a protracted illness, one of the communities most loved and respected citizens, in the person of Mr. Charles E. MacDuff.

The late Mr. MacDuff although in his seventy-ninth year enjoyed vigorous health and was most active until late February, when he contracted pneumonia. Despite the fact that he received the best treatment known to medical science, he failed to make a complete recovery, although he was able to be up and to take short walks during the early part of the summer, however as the weeks passed he gradually grew weaker and approximately five weeks previous to his passing he became confined to his bed and it became evident that his earthly journey was rapidly drawing to its end, and on the above mentioned date he rested in his Lord's home.

The late Mr. MacDuff was widely and most favourably known throughout the Province. As a young man he attended Prince of Wales College after having completed the prerequisite studies he received a first class license as a teacher in the public schools in the Province. Following his chosen profession he taught in various schools in his province for thirty years.

The deceased was a man of stirring character. He possessed a keen mind blended with a sympathetic spirit which endeared him to his many friends during his long and useful life.

The funeral service which was largely attended was held in the Presbyterian Church in Brookfield and was conducted by Rev. T. W. Goodwill, assisted by Rev. G. C. Webster and Rev. J. R. Skinner. The service at the grave was in charge of the Royal Orange Lodge and was conducted by Rev. J. R. Skinner.
