Red Burman Gets Crack At Joe Louis' Heavy Title Tonight

Associated Press Sports Writer NEW YORK, Jan. 30 (AP)—Red Burman's two-year chase for a crack at Joe Louis' heavyweight championship ends in Madison Square Garden tomorrow night.

The Baltimore battler, ranked among the first five heavyweights in the world for the last two years, gets his chance with the Bomber in a fight scheduled for 15 rounds, but which all but Red's very best friends say will make him very sorry he ever got the idea.

Off his record, Burman ranks as the most workmanlike warrior to take a shot at Joe in a couple of years. Yet promoter Mike Jacobs and Louis' own fists are taking Burman so seriously they've already lined up tussles for Joe against Gus Dorazio in Philadelphia next month.

TORONTO, Jan. 30 (CP)—Toronto Maple Leafs increased their National Hockey League lead to six points over the idle Boston Bruins when they defeated the third-place Detroit Red Wings 2-1 here tonight.

A crowd of 11,921 fans saw the bitterly-contested game broken up with less than three minutes play remaining. Sweeney Scherzer, league-leading scorer, bagged the deciding goal—his 17th of the season. He worked in close after taking a pass from D'n Metz.

The Leafs had to come from behind to earn the winning points after trailing the Wings who scored their lone goal in the first period. Syd Howe bagged the Detroit mark.

SCHENECTADY, N.Y., Jan. 30 (AP)—A wide open battle for the North American Speed Skating championship starts tomorrow with defending titleholder Leo Freisinger, stocky Chicago Olympic veteran, a slight favorite.

Main threat to Freisinger in the three-day meet that will determine titles in seven other divisions, is big Ken Bartholomew, the Minneapolis flier, who last week displaced the Chicagoan as National Champion at La Crosse, Wis.

Four others, however, definitely rank as contenders: Vic Renchett, Chicago, winner of the 1938 title; Chuck Leighton, Minneapolis, and Del Lamb, Milwaukee, both former Olympians, and young Ted Elenwood, Amsterdam, N.Y., holder of the Middle Atlantic and Eastern Championships.
