POWER DEVELOPMENT AN IMPORTANT ADJUNCT

Hydro-electric power development on the Mattagami river plays an important part in the developing of the mining and pulp and paper resources of northern Ontario. Three plants on the upper river, with 27,800 h. p. installed, furnish power to the Porcupine gold area while lower down a pulp mill at Smooth Rock Falls is served with an installation of 9,350 h. p. and the largest development on the river at Smoky Falls with 66,250 h. p. installed furnishes power to the pulp and paper mills at Kapuskasing.

STOCK MARKET HURTS HEALTH

(By The Canadian Press) HALIFAX, N. S., Nov. 3.—"Fluctuations of mental health follow the fluctuations of the stock market," said Dr. S. H. Prince, President of the Nova Scotia society for mental hygiene in his report to the society today. He urged wider dissemination of preventive knowledge and greater facilities at existing institutions. "There are times and seasons when the statistics of mental derangement mount with sudden violence," he said. "Such times are periods of war and depression. During the Great War there was an unprecedented amount of nervous and mental breakdown." The present depression was partly responsible for the increase in mental disorders which was sending many into Canadian institutions.
