LONDON, June 18 (CP)—The Admiralty announced tonight that British submarines, credited only Saturday with sinking one heavy cruiser against Axis shipping, had sunk eight additional vessels under German-Italian control, including a troop-carrying schooner.

Other sunken craft were listed as the Italian tanker Giulio Cesare, 3,319 tons, a south-bound enemy supply ship of about 4,000 tons, another supply ship of about 2,500 tons, a 500-ton auxiliary sailing vessel and three smaller Greek fishing boats which had been converted to Axis military needs.
