WARS CAUSED BY TRIFLES.

Countries have plunged into the horrors of war for some very curious and trivial reasons. Perhaps the most extraordinary of all was the spilling of a little water. Mrs. Maubam, the favorite lady-in-waiting to Queen Anne, was carrying a glass of water to her Royal mistress, she accidentally collided with the Marquis de Torey, on whose clothes the water was spilt. High words ensued, and the Marquis, failing to obtain an apology, considered himself and his country insulted. The brilliant campaign of the Duke of Marlborough ensued.
In 1718, a war was brought about by a kiss bestowed by a dashing Bavarian Prince named Ferdinand. During a visit to a neighboring State he inadvertently kissed a beautiful member of the Royal household, Princess Thyra, ignorant of the fact that she was betrothed, and that her fiancée was standing near.

THE PRICE OF AN EAR.

Heated words followed, succeeded by blows. Then came the inevitable duel, which led to the rupture of diplomatic relations, and ultimately to war. The conflict only lasted six weeks, but during that short period over a thousand lives were sacrificed.
On October 17, 1733, England went to war with Spain mainly owing to public excitement over what Burke afterwards described as "the fable of Jenkins' ear." Jenkins was the skipper of a small trading-vessel from Jamaica which was boarded by the commander of a Spanish coastguard boat, who, enraged at finding nothing contraband, flew at the English captain, tore off one of his ears and flung it in his face.
"Carry it to King George," roared the irate Spaniard, "and say we will serve him the same if we get the chance." Jenkins places the ear in a box, which he carried home and presented at the Bar of the House of Commons, relating his adventure, and adding that at the supreme moment of torture, "I commended my soul to God, and my cause to my country."
Hence the crisis which led to the declaration of war.

GERMAN BIRTH RATE IS STEADILY FALLING.
The question of population is being discussed in Germany almost as keenly as in France, for the latest statistics from Berlin show that the birth-rate of the capital is steadily falling. The number of children born for every 1,000 women of age to have children is now only 74, as compared with 200 forty years ago, and, if it were not for immigration, the population of Berlin would decrease at an alarming rate, for there are 20 per cent. less children born there than is necessary to maintain the population.
At the same time, it is not desirable that the country population should be attracted by Berlin or other large cities, where the number of recruits who are rejected for military service is very large. The standard of fitness in the German Empire as a whole is only 85 per cent, but in big cities it falls to 25 or 30 per cent. That is to say, that less than one man in three in Berlin reaches the physical standard. In towns of 500,000 the percentage is 40 per cent., as in towns of 500,000 to 200,000 the figures are nearly 50 per cent. In the country districts it is 50 per cent. and over.
In view of these figures, it can well be understood why German social reformers are questioning the value of the big tenement dwellings, and are turning to the ideal of the garden suburb.
