GREAT BRITAIN EXPANDS "PEACE FRONT"

GERMAN FLEET SAILS FOR SPANISH WATERS

LEAVE KIEL FOR SPRING MA NOEUVRES

No Alarm Felt In Britain But "Keeping Eyes Open."

MALTA, April 13—Officers and men of the British Fleet concentrated at this naval base were unexpectedly ordered tonight to report on board their ships by midnight.

The Admiralty said it had no information on the subject.

BERLIN, April 13—Units of the German fleet sailed from Kiel this afternoon, reliable quarters said, to hold annual spring manoeuvres in the Atlantic off the coast of Spain.

These quarters said the German Government had informed London and Paris of this intention.

It was understood six cruisers, including two of Germany's 10,000-ton pocket battleships, together with destroyers and submarine flotillas, were participating.

Official circles, although they refused to reveal the place picked for the fleet games, emphasized the plans had been in preparation for almost a year.

They cautioned against interpreting the exercises as having any connection with the international situation. On the contrary, they said, if the German Government feared that the European situation were critical, the fleet never would be permitted to go so far from home, nor travel through the English channel.

The place picked for the exercises was not named. It was indicated the ships would stop at several Franco ports on the Atlantic coast and might carry out their manoeuvres in the presence of Nationalist General Franco.

It was understood six cruisers, including two of Germany's 10,000-ton pocket battleships, together with destroyers and submarine flotillas, had left Kiel.

(In London the Press Association said the exercises would last about a month.)

Meanwhile, the newspaper further Zeitung asserted the totalitarian states have at last gained a direct outlet on the Atlantic through Spain's adherence to the Anti-Comintern Pact.

Germany's strategic importance of Spain came from the Boersens-zaitung's military expert, Colonel Von Xylander, who declared that the German Government would maintain under arms a vastly greater force than he needs to defend his own territory. He added Britain's power at Gibraltar and France's predominant role in Morocco are comparable with Spain's right to equality.

Von Xylander urged Spain to profit by today's "favorable circumstances to renew her ancient glory."

Spain's new "dynamism" which "abandons all thought of neutrality" was praised by the Deutsche Allgemeine Zeitung, while the Frankfurter Zeitung warned that the ties between the Rome-Berlin axis and Germany's Government are anything but "platonic."

Express No Alarm

LONDON, April 13—(CP)—Germany's decision to hold spring naval exercises off the Spanish coast was unofficially interpreted here as a Nazi gesture to emphasize Chancellor Hitler's alliance with Nationalist General Franco in the Anti-Comintern Pact.

Three to one naval superiority over Germany viewed the manoeuvres without alarm. Informed sources said that while the Spanish fleet was in the Atlantic, there was no reason to attach unusual significance to the action.

Military Movements Across Frontier Ruls Gibraltar On Alert

GIBRALTAR, April 13—(CP)—The British garrison at Gibraltar, which has been alerted to possible military movements across the frontier, is on a state of high alert.

A detachment of 1,000 Royal Engineers worked to construct a huge barricade about 600 yards from the frontier, ground separated by British and Spanish territory.

Visitors from La Linea told of arrival there of field pieces, machine guns, tanks, troops and ammunition.

NAZIS ATTACK BRITISH PEACE ASSURANCES

Germany Launches Project To Export Nazi Ideals.

BERLIN, April 13—Nazi Germany answered Great Britain's guarantee to Greece and Rumania tonight with assertions that British peace assurances are worthless and charges that British policy is driving Europe into a new "people's war."

Official quarters said Prime Minister Chamberlain in his parliamentary declaration openly admitted he is trying to encircle Germany.

They interpreted his reference to continuing negotiations with Moscow as an effort to "protect British interests with Bolshevism," as was done for 2-3 years at the cost of the Spanish people's lives in the Spanish civil war just ended.

The inclusion of Rumania in the guarantee and the mention of Turkey plainly caught Nazi officials by surprise.

German relations with both countries are held to be very friendly and Nazis said they would be compromised in the view of Germany if it were ascertained that these countries asked for British help.

With the press at home denouncing Great Britain and Nazi spokesmen blaming the democracies for war talk, it appeared that Germany had begun to export National Socialism on a large scale by publications abroad.

Zeltungs-Verlag, important weekly publication of German publishers, disclosed that four Nazi weeklies had been launched in as many countries—Britain, France, Switzerland and the Netherlands.

"Reveal the real nature and development of National Socialist Germany by word and picture beyond the confines of the Reich, and to create relationships of mutual confidence between Germany and the countries where they are guests."

This was something of a reversal of the avowed policy that "National Socialism is not an article of export."

Official spokesman, charging that failure to heed Chancellor Hitler's "plans" for peace put the blame for possible war on the democracies, declared that cancellation of the Berlin-Berlin trade pact and Italian ships by United States companies was "a typical example of panic politics."

Germany May Enter Danzig On April 20, Hitler's Birthday

WARSAW, April 13—(AP)—Poland warmly greeted French and British guarantees to Greece and Rumania as a vital step in the "Stop Hitler" campaign tonight, but continued to increase her own military preparations.

Large forces of German troop concentrations at three points on the Polish frontier were reported in Warsaw.

In Silesia, facing Czecho-slovakia, the famous Polish shrine, although German Ambassador Hans Von Moltke failed to return to Warsaw today as scheduled, Polish leaders expected early reiteration of Germany's demands for outright annexation of Danzig.

They were reports that Chancellor Daladier was expected to visit the Polish Ambassador in Berlin, Joseph Lipski, to enter Danzig on his birthday, April 20.

WAY PAVED FOR ANNEXATION OF ALBANIA

"On To Paris" Chants Fascist Throng Cheering Mussolini.

ROME, April 13—(AP)—Premier Mussolini declared tonight Italy would "march straight ahead," and huge Fascist throngs chanted "On To Paris" after the Fascist Grand Council sanctioned official Albania's union with Italy.

The Grand Council in a 25-minute special session "acknowledged" the Albanian offer of the country's crown to King Victor Emmanuel III of Italy, which the King was certain to accept.

The action gave speedy legal form to the Fascist conquest of Albania in the face of the new Anglo-French pledge to resist aggression in the Mediterranean.

Italian authorities announced later that a delegation of Albanian notables would arrive by airplane tomorrow to present the crown to the King of Italy in a formal ceremony Saturday morning.

Cheered By Crowd

At the conclusion of the Grand Council meeting shortly before midnight, Il Duce and Achille Starace, Fascist Party Secretary, appeared on the balcony of Palazzo Venezia and were greeted by tremendous cheer from the crowd of about 50,000 Fascists gathered below.

Il Duce, interrupted frequently by shouts of "On To Paris," and "Tunisia," told the throng: "The historic events of recent days are the result of our will, of our faith and of our force. We go toward friendly peoples in an attitude of friendship, against hostile peoples we will have a clear, decisive, resolute attitude of hostility."

The world is asked to leave us in peace and tranquility in our task. In any case the world must know that tomorrow, as yesterday and always, we will march straight ahead."

The Premier took no apparent notice of the reference to France by the chanting crowd, which also made occasional shouted references to Corsica, Savoy and Nice.

Prime Minister Chamberlain's announcement in London of the Anglo-French pledge of protection to Rumania and especially Greece evoked expressions of surprise from Fascists.

They cited Greek Premier John Metaxas' note to Foreign Minister Daladier expressing full satisfaction with Italian assurances to respect Greco-Territorial integrity.

Fascists said their troops in Albania had stabilized the Mediterranean situation instead of disturbing it.

"German Culture" Meeting Cancelled In Calgary, Alta.

CALGARY, April 13—(CP)—A veteran's organization has been formed here with the object of preventing any meetings for the purpose of discussing "German Culture," D. Morgan, Imperial representative of the Alberta Command, Canadian Legion announced today.

The organization's formation followed a threat from Great War Veterans last night to "break up a German culture meeting" which later was cancelled on advice from Police Chief David Ritchie.

In a statement Mr. Morgan said: "We, the executive committee of this city are determined that only British culture shall be taught in Canada."

If some people wish to deal with German culture the place for them is in Germany and not in Canada. This new organization is going to see that the British democracy is upheld in Canada."

Pledge Aid To Greece, Rumania Against Attack

Grand Alliance Against Aggression Takes Shape As Premier Chamberlain Makes Statement To Commons

LONDON, April 13—Great Britain and France today cast a protective shield over Rumania and Greece while continuing negotiations with Turkey and Bulgaria to join Poland in a grand alliance against aggressors in Europe.

Concurrent statements in London and Paris by Prime Minister Chamberlain and Premier Daladier pledged the armed strength of Great Britain and France to Rumania and Greece if either of those Balkan countries marshalled its forces to defend its territory from outside aggression.

The Prime Minister made his statement to a one-day special meeting of Parliament. When it re-assembles Tuesday the House of Commons may be told of a military pledge to Turkey. In addition Britain has not given up hope that Bulgaria will join the mutual defence alliance.

MOSLEMS ARE ANGERED BY ITALIAN COUP

DAMASCUS, Syria, April 13—Mounting Moslem anger against Italy's Albanian coup, combined with elimination from Palestine of a prominent Arab terrorist leader, raised hopes in British circles tonight in early improvement of the Palestine situation.

(Secrecy was maintained in Cairo regarding conversations there among Arab leaders on new proposals for a settlement of the Holy Land dispute.)

(A special correspondent of the London News Chronicle (Liberal) reported a move was being made to create a near eastern coalition of Arab states to present a united front to any attempts by Italy or Germany to use the conquest of Albania as a starting point for further aggression in the Mediterranean.)

Denunciation of Italy's invasion of Albania, only Moslem European country, was voted today by Moslem leaders. The reaction was viewed as indirectly benefiting Britain, whose Palestine policy has been steadily attacked by the totalitarian powers.

Cause for satisfaction was given British quarters by news that Gen. Abdul Razzak, late of Palestine's terrorist leaders, had fled into Syria before a British troop detachment and had been interned at Palmira.

The British War Office last January denounced Abdul Razzak and Abdul Rashid Ibragimov as the "two principal" terrorist chiefs. The latter was killed on March 17 while attempting to escape through a British troop cordoned off in the desert. Ibragimov was expected to end large-scale rebel operations.

FRANCE GIVES WARNING TO AXIS POWERS

PARIS, April 13—France, backed by Great Britain, today guaranteed protection to Poland, Rumania and Greece from any aggression—either direct or indirect.

A formal statement issued by Premier Daladier was considered by diplomatic observers to be the strongest warning yet given to Germany and Italy that further expansion would mean war.

"We national forces are prepared to parallel a speech in Parliament by Prime Minister Chamberlain, was:

"The French Government has given to Rumania and Greece particular assurance that in case any action should be attempted, clearly menacing the independence of Rumania or Greece," and which they felt it vital to resist with the national force. The French Government will consider itself bound to lend immediately all the assistance in its power."

"France and Poland guarantee each other immediately and directly against all menace, direct or indirect, which attacks their vital interests."

"Today our ambassadors are communicating this declaration to all interested governments, particularly Turkey."

And:

"The French Government attaches the greatest importance to prevention of any modification to the status quo imposed by force, or by the menace of force, in the Mediterranean and in the Balkan Peninsula."

"Our aim is to organize that necessary collaboration of all the nations which do not think of menacing the vital interests of any people."

"Without vain provocations" France has "taken the military measures which guarantee the frontiers of France and her Empire against all surprise."

Diplomatic observers were particularly impressed by Daladier's apparent desire to leave no diplomatic loophole. They pointed to use of the words "direct or indirect" and "by force or the menace of force" as meaning that France and Britain had taken all they were going to take from the Rome-Berlin Axis.

While the statement was read outside the door of his private office in the War Ministry, Premier Daladier called an extraordinary meeting of his cabinet ministers who discussed tonight what to do with the thousands of Spanish refugees now in France, in the event of war.

Several divisions of troops are being kept from regular duty to guard the refugee camps.

Canada Improves Position Despite Decline In Trade

OTTAWA, April 13—(CP)—Canada improved its position in world trade in 1938, moving from sixth to fifth place, displacing Japan. It was shown today in figures released by the External Trade Branch, Dominion Bureau of Statistics. The United Kingdom held first place in total world trade last year, followed respectively by the United States, Germany, France and Canada.

Canada maintained her position in 1938 as the world's fourth largest exporting country and eighth in respect to imports. The Dominion's total trade last year was \$1,634,170,000 compared with \$1,934,000,000 in 1937. Canada's exports were \$972,750,000 against \$1,224,900,000, a decrease of 15 per cent, while imports declined 16.3 per cent to \$677,450,000 from \$808,080,000.

The decline in exports and imports were the result of lower prices and smaller volume, the report said.

OFFERS PLAN FOR AIDING EMPLOYMENT

OTTAWA, April 13—An 11-point program for comprehensive five attacks on the unemployment problem was laid before the House of Commons tonight by Denton Massey (Con. Toronto-Greenwood) who also threw the House into an uproar with a charge that thousands of transients have died from exposure, illness, starvation and lack of care.

Labor Minister Rogers promptly challenged the transient statement and demanded proof of the ground. Mr. Massey stood his ground in the face of similar demands from many Liberal members but admitted he had no categorical facts before him to prove the truth of the statement. He declared Mr. Rogers could not prove it was untrue.

Mr. Massey's program was outlined at the end of a five-hour conference to present the truth of unemployment and farm relief. The 11 suggestions were:

1. Extensive development of the Northwest Territories;
2. Large-scale afforestation and reforestation;
3. Water conservation and flood control;
4. Development of tourist attractions including highway improvements;
5. Co-operative nation-wide housing plan with Dominion, provincial and municipal government participation;
6. An effective youth re-employment program including technical and vocational education and national scholarships;
7. Establishment of camps along the lines of the civilian conservation corps camps in the United States;
8. An improved employment service under the direction of the Federal Government;
9. Co-operation with private capital along the line of internal economic adjustments;
10. An intensive nationwide public campaign to restore the confidence in business and industry and open up new jobs;
11. A Dominion-Provincial-Municipal conference under the chairmanship of some Member of Parliament like the Earl of Willington to map out a social reform program and bring the present economic system up to date.

Rogers Outlines Youth Training Forestry Scheme

OTTAWA, April 13—(CP)—Labor Minister Rogers tonight announced inauguration of a \$1,000,000 national forestry program as an expansion of the youth training plan.

The program is intended to combine training and employment of young men with protection and development of Canadian forests and wild life conservation, and will be under the joint direction of the Department of Labor and Dominion Forest Service, Department of Mines and Resources, the Minister said.

While the Dominion appropriation stands at \$1,000,000 considerably more than this amount may be expended, it was stated of the \$1,000,000 available, \$600,000 is to be allocated to the provinces on a dollar-for-dollar basis for forest conservation work, subject to Dominion approval of programmes.

The remaining \$400,000 will be used for forest conservation work on Dominion National Parks and Forest Experiment Stations, under supervision of the Dominion Forest Service, Department of Mines and Resources, as a part of the youth training program.

If provincial allocations are all taken up, work will be provided for a total of at least 4,000 men during a five-month period on a dollar-for-dollar basis for forest conservation work, subject to Dominion approval of programmes.

Conditions governing selections of the young men to be employed under the program have been laid down. They must be between 18 and 25 years of age, unemployed, and in necessary circumstances. They will be chosen by local selection boards from applications filed with the provincial employment offices. Enrollment will be subject to medical examination. A training wage will be paid each trainee, plus board, lodging, and medical attendance.

Threat to Status Quo

Mr. Chamberlain, after reviewing Italy's Good Friday invasion of Albania, announced the new pledges in these words:

"The greatest importance of the avoidance of disturbance by force, or threats of force, of the status quo in the Mediterranean and the Balkan Peninsula."

Consequently they have come to the conclusion that, in the event of any action being taken which clearly threatens the independence of Greece and Rumania, and which the Greek or Rumanian Governments respectively consider it vital to resist with their national forces, His Majesty's Government will feel themselves bound to lend at once their full support to the Governments, as the case may be, all the support in their power."

The diplomatic representatives of the following countries heard the Prime Minister speak: Canada, South Africa, Eire, Australia, Belgium, China, Russia, Poland, France, Brazil, Switzerland, Rumania, Norway, Sweden, Denmark, Holland, Greece, Albania, Turkey, Finland and Peru.
