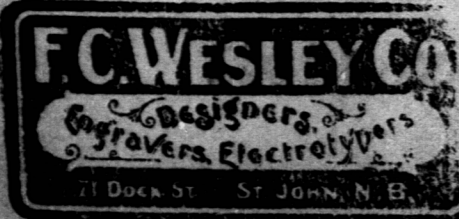

AND WEST

THE Y's will meet in Williard's Hall this evening at 7 o'clock.

MR. WESLEY CRASWELL returned on Tuesday night from a visit to New York.

A few Canadian Trade Reviews left selling at 15 cents each at Jardine and McGregor's.

THE schooner Malabar owned by Capt. Jos. Read is expected here today with a cargo of coal from Port Hood, C. B.

Rev. R. T. Doble and Mrs. Doble left Tuesday morning for Waverly N.S. where Mr. Doble takes the church of England pastorate.

AMONGST the shipments by the Northumberland yesterday were 700 bags of oats, 800 barrels oysters, 220 lambs, a large quantity of pork and sundries.

THE second of the course of entertainments under the auspices of the Y. P. S. C. E. takes place in the Presbyterian Hall this evening when a supper will be given beginning at five o'clock.

THE schooner Stanley Mac which has been loaded here with potatoes by Messrs Jos. Read & Co. leaves this morning for Halifax and after discharging her cargo at that port will sail for Cuba.

REV. GEO. HASLAM, M. A., agent and Manager of the Twentieth Century Fund has been doing good work during his visit to Summerside, meeting with much greater success than was anticipated.

ON account of the rough weather of late oysters have advanced slightly in price. The cheapest oysters today uncolled cost about \$3.25 per barrel landed at Summerside, while best Curlew Island oysters are worth as high as \$5.50 landed here.

MR. McFadyen asked Mr. Sharp if he would recommend that a second train be put on in winter?

MR. Sharp in reply stated that he was not always asked for suggestions. The returns of the railway would have most to do with the matter of accommodation.

REV. A. E. BURKE spoke strongly in favor of a better service. He thought that the business of the railway should not be judged by any short period of the year. He believed that if the trains were arranged to suit the people there would be a greater traffic. He referred to the delays in winter which were chiefly due to there being only one train to do the work of clearing the track. Whether the road pays or not we have the same rights as other parts of the Province. His address was chiefly an attack upon Supt. Sharp on whom he placed a great deal of blame.

CAPT. READ, representing the Summerside Board of Trade was the next to speak. He contended that the people of the West knew better than Mr. Sharp what they wanted and he believed that Mr. Sharp would carry out their wishes as far as in his power. He concurred in the opinion that there should be a better service, said that unwise economy was being used and believed that if freights were less the revenue would be greater. The matter of winter communication was of the most importance to the people of this Province. The Stanley could have run daily on the Summerside Tormentine route last winter, and it was nothing but insane jealousy on the part of the eastern people which prompted them to use their influence against this route.

HON. JES. RICHARDS thought the morning train should be an express. Passengers and mail should be considered before freight. We should have all the advantages possible no matter what the cost. He would like to see two trains in winter. In this way a good deal of expense in keeping the road open would be saved. In referring to the Summerside, Tormentine route, he was of the opinion that it was the best route and hoped to see the Stanley operate here during the coming winter.

MR. RICHARD HUNT brought encouraging words from the Summerside Board of Trade and assured the people of the West that Summerside was with them in advancing their claims with regard to a better train service. He was pleased to see all taking such an interest in the Summerside Tormentine route.

Messrs. J. H. Myrick and Rev. Dr. Chassion also addressed the meeting.
