GERMAN SHIP IN DISTRESS.

THE LIZARD. Feb. 24.—"S O S" signals from the German steamer Widenfels were picked up by sister ship Trautenfels and communicated by wireless telegraph to the signal station at The Lizard today. The distressed Widenfels was half way across the Bay of Biscay on her way from Hamburg to Calcutta with passengers and freight, when the urgent "S O S" signals was caught at noon.

A later wireless despatch from the British steamer Lacoretire bound from La Plata for England, says that the Widenfels does not require any further help. The message ends with the cryptic phrase "The living crew are saved." Shipping men here are unable to understand what this means, unless it indicates that there has been an explosion on board the Widenfels.

The middy blouse and the shirt waist are decidedly American discoveries; Paris accepted them both and this season sent us several pretty middy models made up in cotton crepe and golfine trimmed with buttons and striped novelty cottons. This is quite a departure, as we have been in the habit of fashioning this blouse of heavy linen, duck or serge.

One pretty model made up in white cotton crepe trimmed with blue and white ratine striped with blue and blue bone buttons had a low hung fitted skirt with the buttons arranged so that the girdle could be tightened if necessary.

No. 7615 is a middy design with a shaped girdle (the use of which is optional), a drop shoulder and an attractive collar and laced front opening. For size 36 this design requires 2 1/2 yards of 36 inch material.
