Mrs. Harry Cudmore, Diploma'd Guide, assisted by Miss Mabel Mathieson, District Captain (Drill) and Miss Pearl Burns (singing) conducted an intensive course on the different phases of Guiding. The needs of the adolescent girl in the past few years to help her in her life at this time and in the years to come, plans for interesting and instructive meetings and above all the value of guiding as a youth training movement, were among the topics discussed at the meetings which began on Friday and continued through Saturday and Sunday.

Princess Edward Island is indeed fortunate in having Mrs. Cudmore, who is the only Diploma'd Guide in the Maritimes, available for this course. It is a pleasure to have her returned to their various companies and packs filled with enthusiasm, inspiration and the desire to put into practice as soon as possible the many new ideas gathered during this training.

43 Guiders attended the conference, representing Guide Companies or Brownie Packs from Summerside, Borden, Kensington, Georgetown, Montague, Parkdale and Charlottetown.

In the general discussions which followed each session the Guiders found opportunities for having some of their own problems solved and were given constructive advice in practical administration.
