The latest news, first of all.

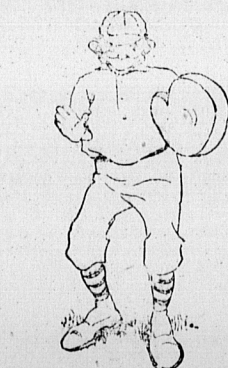
