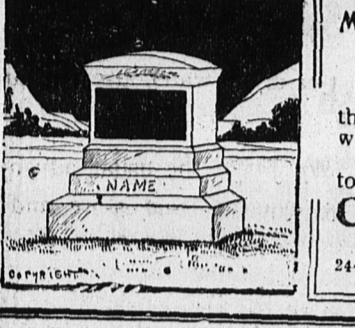

Successful Year for BRUCE STEWART & CO. LTD

Shown by Annual Reports Submitted at General Annual Meeting. Dividend of Seven Per Cent Declared.

The seventh annual general business meeting of the corporation of Bruce Stewart & Co. Ltd., was held last night in the company's office. The directors and a large number of shareholders were present. The directors' report and annual financial statement were submitted by the secretary, treasurer, Major C. L. McKay. The report showed a very successful year, the amount of business turned over being \$160,000, a considerable increase over that of the previous year. A proposal to erect a new building on the site of the foundry recently burned was submitted. The proposition was to install in the new building a complete outfit for the exclusive manufacturing of gasoline engines. The proposal, in view of the growing demand for the Imperial Motor, was heartily approved by the shareholders. The carrying out of this proposal would, it was shown, necessitate an outlay of \$50,000 for which new stock would be solicited. A resolution authorizing this action was accordingly adopted.

The amount of wages paid by the concern during the year was \$45,000. During the year the directors added a very valuable and important property to the assets of the company, the year in the purchase of the Steam Navigation Company's Wharf, on which the present plant is located. This property is one of the most valuable wharf properties in the city and the firm considers itself fortunate in having secured it. The ship chandlery and sail making department, known as A. Kennedy & Co. did a thriving business during the year. Reference was made in the report to the shell making industry. Should orders of sufficient amount be secured to justify the installation of a plant the firm expressed its willingness to take such steps as would be considered necessary to take up the same. The net profits for the year were \$10,000.

TURKISH ARMY NOW MERE MOB

(Canadian Press Dispatch.)

LONDON, March 5.—The remnants of the Turkish force retreating from Kut-el-Amara have been shattered completely, according to information given out in the House of Commons today. The Turks, it was said, would reach Bagdad only as a disorganized mob.

This information was received from General Maude, Commander of the British expedition on the Tigris front, and was announced by Henry W. Forster, the Financial Secretary to the War Office.

PLOT TO KILL PRESIDENT WILSON

HOBOKEN, N. J., March 5.—An alleged plot against the life of President Wilson has been uncovered here, according to detectives who today arrested Fritz Holm, a German resorvist from Mexico. In a hotel where Holm had engaged a room were found two bombs which the detectives said were to have been sent tonight to the President.

Re-establish Prestige.

The rout of the Turks on the Tigris River north of Kut-el-Amara is expected by the military officials to do much to restore British prestige in the middle east.

In his weekly talk reviewing recent war operations Major-General Frederick B. Maurice, Chief Director of Military Operations at the British War Office expressed great satisfaction regarding the recent British successes over the Turks which, he said, would tend to establish the above results. He said: "It is undeniable that our prestige suffered much from the Dardanelles operations, from the fact that we were on the defensive for a long time in Egypt and because of our retreat from Bagdad. This condition now is completely changed. The Turkish forces have been driven entirely from Egyptian territory and the decisive defeat with which they met at Kut completes our ascendancy."

Brilliant Operation.

"General Maude's crossing of the Shurman bend over 400 yards of flooded river was a particularly brilliant military operation. It compelled the Turks to withdraw rapidly from Sannayvat and enables us to pursue them on the high side of the river. There are no marshes there so floods will not impede our movements as they did when we were advancing below Kut-el-Amara."

"Last week was particularly interesting elsewhere. The war loan proved our material resources while the Germans on the western front made their highest withdrawal since the battle of the Marne."

"How far they will retire I can not say, but they will not retire only when they are forced to leave either by the economical necessity of saving their losses or from a position which our superior location prevents them from holding."
