The deceased had been ailing for some time, but hope for her recovery was given until the previous night when she took a turn for the worse. She was loved and highly respected by all who knew her. Some suspicion having been entertained as to the health of the cattle on the farm in connection with Falconwood Hospital, the Provincial Government consulted the Veterinary Inspector General with the result that Dr. Pethick was authorized to inspect the cattle. This week, Dr. Pethick subjected the whole herd of about thirty five cattle to the tuberculin test, and six of the animals are once isolated and will be slaughtered under federal direction or otherwise dealt with as may be advised by the Veterinary Director General. The buildings will be thoroughly disinfected and a further test will be made of the herd in the course of about ninety days to ascertain whether any of the others are suffering from the disease in the incubation stage.

FLOODS UNABATED.
LONDON, August 28.—The cessation of rain in most parts of England after a month's downpour, has not been accompanied yet by an abatement of floods. Norwich, in the east, is still cut off from the outside world except by telephone. Ordinarily 70 trains enter and leave

the city every day, but no one has arrived or departed since Monday. The traffic on the Great Eastern railway is demoralized. Many parts of the line are flooded so bad, the trains are obliged to creep along slowly. Traffic for twelve miles each side of Norwich has been entirely suspended. Rescue operations are proceeding in that city where

many houses in the lower part of the town have been inundated up to the second floor. Women in some instances impede the work, refusing to leave their homes and having to be forcibly removed. It is feared that a new dam recently erected at Costenasy, may give way and produce great destruction in the vicinity.


