### SUNDAY SCHOOL LESSON

LESSON IX. JUNE 2. HYPOCRISY AND SINCERITY. Matt 6: 1-8.

**GOLDEN TEXT.**  
"Take heed that ye do not your righteousness before men, for ye have no reward with the Father who is in heaven."—Matt 6: 1.

**POINTED SUGGESTIONS.**

The principal and interpretations which are to guide the children of the Kingdom of God and the one transcendent example of holiness in the Kingdom which they are to follow have been set forth in the chapter preceding the lesson. As the children of the Kingdom come to the point of aggressive endeavor and attempt to enter upon a life of positive holiness they will do well to take heed of certain fundamental and grievous faults and avoid them. They are the property of hypocrites.

The one who exercises himself unto godliness does it by a living piety which expresses itself in a three-fold way: 1. In almsgiving, which is the expression of his religion in relation to others. 2. In prayer, which is the expression of his religion in relation to God. 3. In fasting, which is the same thing in relation to himself. Jesus found these methods of pious endeavor in use in His day. He did not set them aside nor did He suggest any substitutes.

But the Master calls attention in the lesson to a striking and startling way to the fact that men can and do make a parade of piety, and that they do it so glaringly that all the piety they have is more show than reality. It is the real thing as the scene of the actors upon the stage is the real life. What Jesus calls for is sincerity. What He inculcates is the necessity of heart-reliance.

Of course, the choice is still open. If the preference a man has is for the applause of men he will edge more and more towards the showy in the methods of his devotion until nothing but the show remains. But if the preference is for the Divine approval he will seek to serve God in the ways which are most simple and humble and loving and which most surely purge the heart of pride.

Almsgiving, without a doubt, will be one expression of the Christian devotion of a child of God. But he will go about it in such a way and he will make his offerings in such a spirit that nothing will amaze him more than to be congratulated. It will likely be discovered that he is in principle a tither that he keeps a Lord's purse out of which he does not give, but from which the beneficiaries of the Lord receive their own.

Is there any danger in our day (or is the suggestion unwarrantably pessimistic?) that men neither pray in secret nor upon the street corners? Verily, men do pray, but when and why? Well, Jesus warns men against rattling through their prayers. They must think of the meaning of them. There ought to be no backwardness in coming to God in prayer. He knows what we have need of before we ask him.

A suggestive way in which to study and make use of the prayer which Jesus has taught us when we pray to say is to think of the several relations to God in which the different portions of the prayer place us. The writer is indebted to another for what he is passing on.

"Our Father which art in heaven," suggests that we are children away from home.

"Hallowed be Thy name"—that puts us in the place of worshippers. What is worship? Ought it to mean much or little?

"Thy kingdom come." Who but the patriotic can fill the measure of that prayer because his heart is charged with it?

"Thy will be done." Into what relation with God does that put the suppliant?

Thus, as the prayer is further made use of we learn that we are servants and dependants and prodigals and probationers.

### SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

ANY person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any Agency, on certain conditions by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader. Duties—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister. In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside upon the homestead or pre-emption six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra. A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain pre-emption, may enter for a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$20.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$200.00.
