WIFE FEED CATS WITH HIM

WORCESTER, June 1.—The hearing on the domestic relations of Dr. and Mrs. Robert A. Pierce was continued in the probate court today.

Today Dr. Pierce on the witness stand, said that at one time his wife had 22 cats and it was not an uncommon event for her to let the cats drink milk from a saucer on the table while he was eating his meals. His wife frequently picked fleas from the cats while he was eating his meals, he said.

Mrs. Pierce is suing for separate maintenance on the grounds of cruel and abusive treatment and at the hearing last week said that her husband threw cups, saucers and plates at her.

BLEACHED FLOUR IS COMMON.

OTTAWA, June 1.—The inland revenue department has issued an interesting bulletin on bleached flour. Judging from the samples taken up by the inspectors in all parts of Canada it would appear that about twenty per cent of the Canadian flour now on the market is whitened by the addition of oxides of nitrogen. A small quantity of the oxides may be absorbed from the atmosphere but there is no doubt that in some cases the flour has been exposed to nitrogenous oxides for the purpose of bleaching the same. There is no statute specifically forbidding this, but an order-in-council may be passed standardizing flour, which will declare impure any flour containing an appreciable quantity of these oxides of nitrogen. It is an open question as to whether this method of bleaching is deleterious.

15 OVERCOME AT FIRE.

DENVER, Col., June 1.—Fifteen persons, mostly firemen, were overcome by smoke in a fire in a wholesale grocery. Three of the firemen are in a serious condition. The rest soon recovered. The firemen were trying to rescue people from the burning building and were with difficulty themselves rescued.
