Literature And Life

MOTHER AND HOME

I think we may say that four pillars of the state are home, church, law and patriotism. No state can be secure without these. We may say too that as important a pillar as any is the home. Moreover, it is surely no exaggeration to affirm that while the modern home has comforts and conveniences that our forefathers knew nothing about, that institution has lost, or is fast losing, a great deal of its influence. Does not the prevalence of juvenile crime show that there is something radically wrong? Is it true that what we call discipline is falling down? Have children too much of their own way, and too little of that reason which is hard to adjust themselves to the larger world that awaits them?

We may think of a home in terms of a house, for there can be no home without that to begin with. Now a house has a foundation, a roof and at least four walls. The book of Proverbs says that Wisdom is to build her house and "she has hewn out seven pillars." It is left to our imagination to say what these seven pillars shall be, and that shall depend on what our theory of life is.

The foundation of a home needs more than money. Was not Abraham Lincoln born in a house which had no window? It was humble enough, but it had a foundation. Lincoln never forgot what he owed to his stepmother. That home had as its foundation love, and without this there is no home worth the name.

There used to be a saying among Scotch people that "a home without prayer was a home without a roof." A Hebrew writer speaks of the wings of the Almighty God was to him a shelter. To those who live in a home like that life would be safe.

Some one has said that the four walls of a home are - truth, obedience, courage and sacrifice. John Ruskin, in his "Seven Lamps of Architecture" says that one of the lamps which builders should hold in their hands is the lamp of "truth" and he deals with two of the other essentials that go to building - the lamps of "sacrifice" and the lamp of "obedience" and what he calls the lamp of "power" we might equate with the idea of "courage" above mentioned. Ruskin had no place for decoration in building, the imitation of a stone pillar by a painted one was a violation of building by the light of the lamp of truth. He said that architecture should be "honest."
