

"SOILGRO" FOR AGRICULTURAL USE

VERY CAREFULLY CARRIED OUT SERIES OF TESTS of Soilgro in fairly rich soil with wheat, oats, barley and corn, showed an increased yield over the same grain crops not treated, from 24 to 38 per cent. They also matured earlier and were much better quality than the untreated.

CORN WHICH HAD BEEN TREATED, ripened in a section of Northern Manitoba where it had not been known to ripen before, and the half of the field, not treated, did not ripen but was not green.

A FIELD OF OATS NEAR TORONTO which was treated with Soilgro, showed a largely increased yield over an adjoining field not treated, while a field of ensilage corn North of Toronto, showed an increase of well over 50 per cent. greater than the next field which was not treated.

ALL KINDS OF FIELD CROPS require practically the same plant food as our garden crops, and while soil and climate conditions may vary the exact increase in yield from the use of Soilgro the results are much the same with field crops as with the garden crops.

FOR THE GRAIN FARMER

Soilgro will produce earlier and better grain crops, if used according to directions. To get the best results the seed should be treated before planting. The cost of Soilgro in quantity is so moderate that the grain grower can well afford to use it unsparingly. Where Soilgro is used the estimated increase in crops is from 10 to 50 per cent., depending upon soil and climatic conditions. All seeds treated with Soilgro, on test, have germinated in about one-third less time than untreated seeds. Soilgro treatment not only accelerates and increases growth but it improves the quality of the product. For example, to grow a much finer quality of wheat means much to the farmer.

Follow for grain seeds the general directions, allowing sufficient time while the seeds are immersed in the Soilgro solution for them to soften, and for the bacteria to become attached to the seeds. But do not leave them immersed long enough to permit germination.

Let the seeds dry out after this in a warm shady place on a dry surface, spreading them out in thin layers. Seeding should be proceeded with as soon as the seeds are dry enough to go through the drill seeder.

FOR THE DAIRY FARMER

Soilgro is most excellent for pasture growths. Soilgro is so inexpensive that the dairy farmer can use it on his pasture land and get increased crops of alfalfa, clover, hay, etc.

Treatment is the same as for lawns, by spraying with the diluted solution of Soilgro.

Periodical applications, particularly in times of drought, will insure permanently green pastures.

FOR THE GROWER OF ROOT CROPS

SOILGRO gives a much better yield with much finer quality For Seeds.—Same directions as for vegetables above. For Plants.—Same directions as for transplanting.

FOR THE FRUIT GROWER:

SOILGRO is excellent for tree, vine and bush fruits. In setting out fruit trees, bushes and plants, if roots are first treated with SOILGRO, a much smaller percentage of the shrubs will be lost.

Spray the ground frequently with SOILGRO diluted solution. FOR POTATOES

Arranging Flowers in Borders

Upon the arrangement of annuals in a garden depends, to a great extent, the effectiveness of the display. This arrangement will depend upon the juxtaposition of colors and the height and manner of growth of the plant. It is apparent that a six-inch annual should not be placed beside a three or four-foot one, so it is essential to study the height of the plants in arranging the grouping. It is an excellent idea to grade the height from the dwarf edging plants at the front of the bed or the border to the taller ones at the back, so that each shall hide the lower stems of the others. The grading, however, should not be attempted with too great regularity, owing to the monotony of the

effect, some of the taller growers being brought to the front of a border to make a varied outline and some of the lower growing groups being allowed to dip further back into the border. In a series of beds the grading can be done more effectively with the lower-growing plants in the central beds and the taller ones in the outer beds. Color arrangement is a matter of individual taste. The garden should be planted to colors the owner prefers and admires. Others do not like yellows. Others do. There is ample material to give any color as the prevailing tone desired in the garden. Avoid sharp contrasts such as scarlet and bright yellow in quantity. Harmony rather than contrast will give better effect. In general, pinks and blues, lavenders and oranges, pale yellows

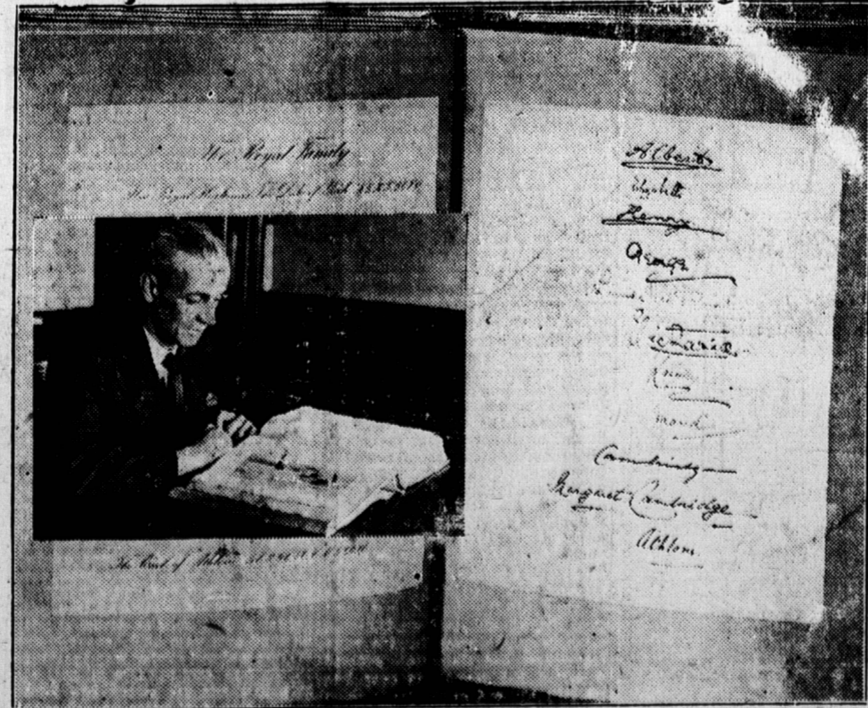
