### Premier's Bungling Of Subsidy Claims Stressed At Eldon

Premier Lea, From Seat On Platform, Hears Exposed His Own Bungling And Incompetency While Audience Applauds Lustily. Rousing Reception Tendered Conservative Speakers.

Scoring the Lea Government for its bungling and incompetency in presenting before the Audit Board an "ideal budget" for the next ten years which actually amounted to less than the expenditures now being made, and which would leave the Province still hopelessly in the hole financially, Dr. W. J. P. MacMillan, supporting the Conservative candidates Messrs Shaw MacMillan and George MacLean at the Eldon meeting last night advanced an unanswerable argument against returning Premier Lea and his followers to power for another four years in this Province.

Both Mr. MacLean and his colleague Mr. Shaw MacMillan were in splendid form. The applause they received was deafening at times, and rose to cheering.

Mr. MacLean, who was greeted with prolonged cheers and applause, instanced the amusing misreports of the previous meetings in the district, which have appeared in the Patriot newspaper.
