TEN YEARS OF THEFT FOR THIRTEEN CENTS

CHICAGO, Dec. 16.—Stealing thirteen cents proved unlucky for Wm. Horn and James Matthews, who must stay in the penitentiary for ten years. Both are hold-up robbers. They were convicted of holding up Ruth Korbitz, aged 16, threatening her with death if she made an outcry, and stealing thirteen cents, all the money she had. The pair had committed other robberies the same night, but the Korbitz hold-up was the only one that could be traced unmistakably to them, and, on the strength of that they were given ten-year sentences by Judge Hebel.

SALMON CANNERS OPPOSE CLOSE SEASON IN FRASER

OTTAWA, Dec. 16.—Robert Goss is understood to be on his way to Ottawa to discuss with the Government and members of the British Columbia fisheries the report made by the commission. Mr. William Duff, the Chairman of the commission, is also expected in Ottawa this week, and both will be in conference with the Government on the matter. It is understood that Mr. Goss, in the name of the canners, will oppose the recommendations contained in the report, and particularly that which advises the closing of the Fraser River for five years.



"Preachers I Have Met"

REV. J. F. DENNY.

A writer in the Daily Argosy, Georgetown, British Guiana writing under the above heading says: When one thinks of the Wesleyan Clergy, he gets into contact with a real, live force. I have a fair acquaintance with Wesleyan folk, and, I think most people will agree with me when I say that of all Protestant folk there are none more worthy of respect inasmuch as they practise what they preach, and indulge in no adoption, as the right thing, of the error which they repudiated as wrong. Some people elect to regard the Wesleyans as straight-laced, but I fancy there is much to be gained thereby provided that attitude of mind does not verge on to the detestable condition of being prudish.

The Grand Old Man What memories does the name of the late Rev. D. J. Reynolds, the Grand Old Man of local Methodism send reverberating through the corridors of time. Any who knew him must agree that he was a man among men, a man who I think felt that earth was made for men to be happy, within certain limits and that Christianity was not meant to be the wearing of a long, sombre countenance and one's heart upon his sleeve. That he has departed this life has been a severe blow to Methodism; more, the loss of his benign influence is felt within borders outside his own sphere. His was a mind that could accommodate itself to all sorts and conditions of men, and while he could flay wrongdoers, he mixed his exhortations with the milk of human sympathy which led the errant to feel that there was yet a chance for him which after all should be the objective of all corrective systems, a circumstance which happily is appreciated by the latest acting Magistrate in Georgetown, who it is to be hoped will not be deflected from his course by ill-judged sneers at his jazz drum idea.

Revs. Wade and Denny

Two of the most interesting personalities in connection with the Ministry of this Church are the Revs. J. Fawcett Denny and R.E. R. Wade. Both these are young men who realized in great degree the urgent necessity of securing men and people generally, whom they are young. To meet Mr. Denny was to meet a charming personality, in whose company it was impossible to be dull, though he was always burning with the evangelistic zeal. As a pulpit orator, he had few equals and could sway men in a moment. No less successful was Mr. Wade, a man also of great personal charm. To him young men flocked as to a magnet, and none went either to him or to Mr. Denny and came away without being benefited. Like Mr. Denny Mr. Wade was a forceful preacher, and his sermons were an inspiration. There are not a few men who elect to despise Christianity and attendance at public worship, yet several of these have been heard to admit after hearing either of these two preachers that it was a good thing to go to Church, and that the world would have been a dreary place without religion.

LAMB TO TOUR PRAIRIE ON IMMIGRATION PLAN

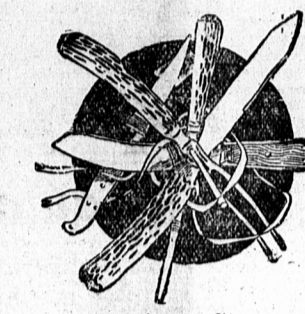
