The boys of the Niobe who have been enjoying a three weeks' leave of absence after their ship had grounded at Clark's Harbor, leave on return this morning. The young fellows spent a pleasant time at their homes and all enjoyed their leave immensely. They have been favored in this way since joining, having had in all about seven weeks' leave at different times.

After the usual interesting Sunday School in Rosebery Hall on Sunday, Aug. 27th, the pastor Rev. Mr. McKenzie of St. John's Presbyterian Church, Belfast, administered the rite of baptism to six small children varying in ages from two months upwards. The addresses by Mr. McKenzie were fitting and instructive and all joined heartily in singing appropriate hymns. The hall was filled and the usual order prevailed. The babies behaved beautifully in their strange surroundings. In closing Mr. McKenzie expressed his pleasure in the success of the Sunday School and the interest shown, and made encouraging remarks to both old and young.

The directors of the Maritime Exhibition which is to be held in Chatham, N. B., from September 15th to 16th, are doing their utmost to make it Maritime in more than name. They have written personal letters to several of P. E. I.'s best grain growers asking them to send exhibits, and at the last meeting of their committee held on August 21st, they decided to offer sweep stake prizes of \$15.00 each for grain and roots open to the Maritime Provinces. As the farmers of New Brunswick buy most of their seed grain, it would appear to be a splendid opportunity for Island growers of good seed to introduce it in New Brunswick. It is to be hoped that the grain exhibit will be sent, even if the exhibit of roots should not be made.

At a recent meeting of the Executive Committee of the Sunday School Association at Summerside the Field Secretary Rev. W. A. Ross gave a report of the different District Conventions held during the month. Mr. Ross' report was helpful. Most of the conventions and meetings held were of a very satisfactory nature, the attendance being good and much interest manifested. It is hoped that in all the districts a renewal of interest will be evidenced in Sunday School work. The report of the treasurer was presented and whilst several of the districts are paying up their allocations there are some which have not yet been heard from. The Executive expect that the officers in every district will give prompt attention to see that their full allocation is sent in without further delay.

The coming Provincial Convention at Montague on October 10-12 was fully discussed and a draft of the program submitted. Prominence will be given to the Elementary Department, the Teacher Training Department and the Adult Bible Class Movement. Special attention will be given to the devotional exercises at the opening of every session and it is proposed to set apart fifteen minutes at the close of each session for special talks of an evangelistic or spiritual nature. The feeling is already spreading that the Provincial Convention of 1911 will be the best yet held. The District meeting referred to was held on Friday night last.
