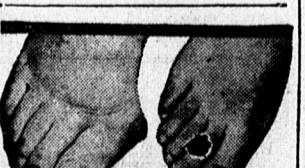

Stream of British Migration Again Flowing to Canada

LONDON, Feb. 18.—The stream of British migration is again flowing toward Canada and the tide in that direction is rising faster than elsewhere. Hon. W. G. A. Armsby-Gore, under-Secretary of State for Colonial Affairs, asserted in the House of Commons tonight, introducing a supplementary estimate of £142,000 (about \$690,150) all of which is to be spent on additional assisted passages to the Dominions. The under-Secretary stated that in 1925 39,000 Britishers migrated to the Dominions and in 1926 this number increased to 66,000. Last year 33,000 went to Australia, compared with 22,000 in 1925; 21,000 went to Canada, compared with 9,000 the preceding year and 12,000 went to New Zealand in comparison with 8,000 in 1925.

Copy of Budget Sent Fielding

OTTAWA, Feb. 18.—While crowded galleries attentively listened to Mr. Robb's budget statement in the House today there was a happy remembrance of Mr. Fielding, who in his day, delivered more budget speeches than any finance minister in the Empire. As soon as Mr. Robb rose a messenger, on instructions from the minister, was despatched to Mr. Fielding's home with a copy of the budget.

Islander Reaches Century Mark

ST. JOHN, Feb. 18.—Angus McPhee of East Saint John, yesterday reached the age of 100 years. The centenary of his birth found him enjoying good health and happiness. He has lived in the reign of five British sovereigns—George IV, William IV, Queen Victoria and George V. Mr. McPhee was born in Georgetown, P. E. I., in 1827. He came to Saint John in 1855, and of two marriages the following children survive: William McPhee, Saint John; Mrs. J. H. Sheehan, Park Ave., Saint John; Rudolph McPhee, Nova Scotia; Mrs. Ora Yerxa, Norton, N. B.; Mrs. Norman McCabe, of Bath, Me., and Mrs. Alister McDonald of Georgetown, P. E. I. The late Rev. R. P. McPhee, Catholic priest, of Rustico, P. E. I., was a brother, and there is a sister living in Prince Edward Island, who is over 90 years of age.
