FALSE HAIR IDEAL DISEASE SPREADER.

DETROIT, Mich., Feb. 14—A strange skin disease which physicians believe is leprosy, has developed in a young girl who up to a few weeks ago was employed in a local hair store where false hair of all kinds is dealt in. Some time ago the girl, whose name is withheld, noticed a peculiar skin trouble on her scalp and hands. The blotches grew in number, and frightened at last by the mysterious malady, she consulted physicians, two of whom have declared that the patient has contracted leprosy, while others confess ignorance of the nature of the disease. Dr. Andrew P. Biddle, an eminent skin specialist, has sent out a public warning to women who use false hair, urging that they discontinue its use immediately. He says scalp troubles which result from its use are without number. The proper disinfection of such articles as "rats" and switches is well nigh impossible, and diseases of all kinds may easily be carried in the hair.

HUSBAND KILLS HIS WIFE.

TORONTO, Feb. 15—William Withers, a burly negro, inflamed with jealousy, shot his wife dead. He then shot Mrs. Thomas Davis, an aged woman, and when the house was surrounded by policemen, retreated to the garret and put a bullet into his own head, after exchanging a number of shots with the police and wounding Officer Morris in the knee.

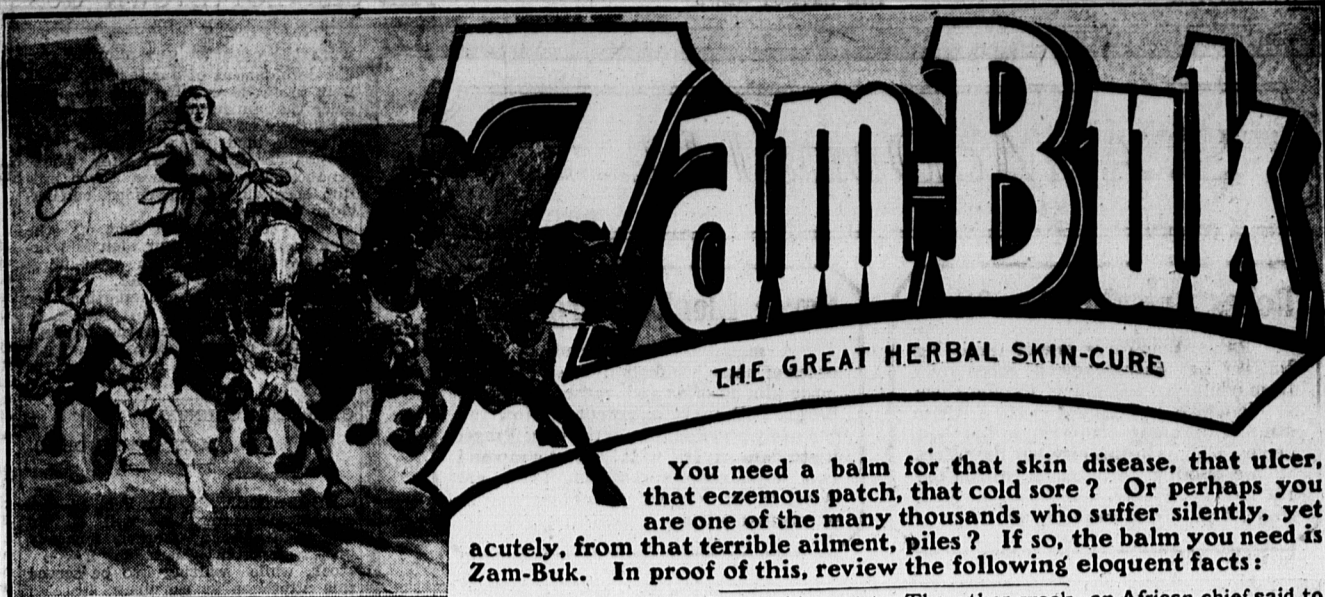
