IN MEMORIAM

PETER MACKENZIE.

Mr. Peter MacKenzie, in his time one of the best known men in West Pictou, died on Friday night of last week, aged 72 years. On Sunday the funeral, conducted by the Masons, took place to Sea View Cemetery. Mr. MacKenzie, ran a ferry for a number of years between Pictou and the Landing, and later conducted a store at Rustico. He early saw the possibilities of the place as a summer resort, and was one of the pioneers in developing it. Some years ago he sold out at the Landing and came to Prince Edward Island, where he did business until a year or so ago, when he returned to Pictou and later to the Landing. He leaves a widow, and two brothers, Duncan and Hector, retired sea captains. Mr. MacKenzie was not very long ill, but for rugged frame as he was, it soon became evident that internal troubles had placed him beyond human aid. Deceased was a man of cheerful disposition and won many friends wherever he was known. A kind and good hearted man, people of all nationalities found a welcome from him and his partner in life at their home. As a sea-faring man, Captain MacKenzie, in his boyhood days visited many parts of the world, and the younger people were always interested to hear of those trips. For a few years he conducted a grocery store at Hunter River, but when he felt old age coming on he returned to his native town to pass his remaining years.
