THE ESTIMATES BROUGHT DOWN IN COMMONS.

(Continued from page one.) salaries of post-office, inspectors of offices. Details are P. E. Island division, salaries \$5100 an increase of \$2500; N. S. division, salaries \$21,750 an increase of \$1,300; N. B. division, salaries \$1,782,425; an increase of \$162,825.

The Public Works department asks two millions for a new building at Ottawa.

Appropriations for mail subsidies include \$229,500 for service between Canada and West Indies, an increase of about \$80,000.

Subsidies to provinces show slight decrease for Ontario, Quebec, Nova Scotia, Alberta, Manitoba gets an increase of \$617,114; P. E. I. an increase of \$100,000.

In the estimates for the agriculture department are increases amounting to \$70,000 for experimental farms; \$50,000 for branch stations; \$200,000 for exhibitions; \$50,000 for the development of dairy and fruit industries; \$98,000 to develop the live stock industry; \$100,000 for the health of animals; \$25,000 to enforce meat and canned food act and \$60,000 for cattle quarantine stations.

Note on I. C. R., \$13,000,000; Windsor Branch \$43,000; P. E. I. Railway, \$490,000; capital expenditure on railways and canals \$38,648,945, of this the I. C. R. gets \$7,239,650. P. E. I. R. 1,000,000 Hudson Bay Railway, \$4,500,000 for construction, terminals and elevators. The National transcontinental \$19,000,000; Quebec Bridge \$3,000,000; canals generally, \$1,888,695; I. C. R. and P. E. I. R., capital expenditures, include \$190,000; to strengthen bridges; Halifax total vote for docks, wharves, new terminals and increased accommodations \$4,011,000; St. John improvements at depot \$13,000. Charlottetown, machinery \$4,500; original construction \$1,000.

Under harbors and rivers are the following appropriations: St. John improvements \$2,600,000; Quebec \$11,000,000.

Under public buildings, Summerside public building new roof and addition \$9,000; Tignish public building \$8,000. In the I. C. R. St. John is a drill hall, \$100,000; new post office \$130,000; Dominion buildings, \$50,000; cottages house improvements \$8,500; quarantine station and Partridge Island water supply \$77,000.

Under Harbors and Rivers, Georgetown, repairs wharf \$1,000; Grand River, South, wharf reconstruction \$60,000; Head St. Peters Bay, reconstruction, wharf \$50,000; Harbors, Rivers and bridges, \$12,000; Miminogash Harbor, repairs, \$1500; Nauique Pond Breakwater \$2500; New London repairs, harbor works, \$2000; North River, Franklin Point wharf \$10,000; Port Selkirk, repairs, piers \$750; Robinsons Island, repairs breakwater \$1,000; Rustico Harbor, repairs breakwater, \$1,000; Souris, repairs breakwater, \$2,000; Souris extension breakwater \$40,000; Summerside Harbor, completion breakwater, \$3500; St. Peter's Bay, repairs breakwaters, \$1500; Tignish harbor, repairs breakwater for beach protection \$5,000; Tracadie Breakwater \$2,000.

As a kind of advertisement of their intention they are going to hold one more great lottery, in which anybody may take part in any quarter of the world. The drawing will take place in Rome. This last lottery will carry prizes amounting to more than \$400,000, and each ticket costs half a crown. The first prize is to be \$300,000, and the Bank of Italy will pay this sum to the lucky possessor of the ticket bearing the winning number. There are also 8,382 other prizes, ranging in value from \$24,000 downwards.

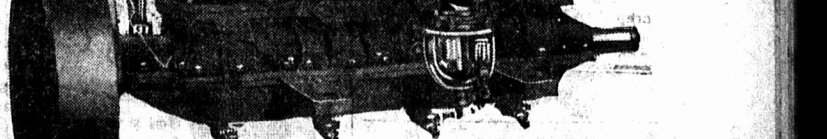
