When your order for help has been placed with National Selective Service, you may then send your advertising direct to The Guardian. The Guardian will apply for its approval by National Selective Service. Copy received that requires such approval must be phoned in before 12 o'clock noon the day before publication.

NATIONAL SELECTIVE SERVICE RESTRICTIONS DO NOT APPLY TO

Female domestic help and employment wanted ads where not more than one servant employed. Not to advertisements for men over 65 and under 17 years of age, women over 60 and under 16 years of age, ministers, teachers, casual labor, part time subsidiary employment, housewives as part time workers up to 54 hours weekly, nurses, farm hands, fishermen, domestic and kitchen help required for hospitals and philanthropic institutions, students at work after school or on holidays other than long summer vacation, and any kind of "Help Wanted" advertisement from any Provincial Government.

NOTE: Domestic and Kitchen help required for hospitals and philanthropic institutions is now included in the above exempted group. Also the age for women has been lowered to enable those over 60 to seek employment without reference to National Selective Service.

NEW REGULATIONS FOR PART TIME HELP - You may now advertise directly for housewives to work up to 24 hours weekly. Such advertising is not subject to National Selective Service regulations.

Also there is no limit to the number of hours considered part time, but such copy must state that applicant has other full time work.

Declaration Day Makes No Change in Standing

Declaration Day yesterday resulted in confirming earlier reports of the provincial general election so far as the party standing is concerned. Twenty Liberal and ten Progressive Conservative members were declared elected by the respective returning officers. In Fourth Kings Mr. Murdoch McGowan (P.C.) increased his majority from 2 to 4. This was the most closely contested seat. Other close contests were in Third Prince, where Hon. Marin Gallant had a majority of 14; Fourth Prince, where Hon. Horace Wright had 19 majority, and First Queen's, where Mr. Walter MacKenzie's majority over his Liberal opponent was 18.
