WEATHER SIGNS.

The following formula of weather signs was adopted by the Farmers' club of the American Institute some years ago, and it has been found to give satisfaction.

When the temperature falls suddenly there is a storm forming south of you. When the temperature rises suddenly there is a storm forming north of you. The wind always blows from a region of fair weather. Cumulus clouds always come from a region where a storm is forming. When cirrus clouds are moving rapidly from the north or northeast, no matter how cold it is, there will be rain within twenty-four hours. When cirrus clouds are moving rapidly from south or southeast there will be a hailstorm on the morrow, if it be in summer, and if it be in the winter there will be snow.

The wind always blows about a storm in a circle. When it blows from the north the heaviest rain is east of you. If it blows from the south the heaviest rain is west of you. If it blows from the east, the heaviest rain is south. The wind never blows even moderately unless rain or snow is falling within a radius of 1,000 miles.

Whenever heavy white frost occurs a storm is forming within 1,000 miles north or northwest of you.—Christian Herald, Almanac.

AGRICULTURE, BY CHARLES N. WILLIAMS, HORTICULTURIST.

The Honey Bee by C. Gordon Howitt, B. Sc., bulletin No. 69, Experimental Farm, Department of Agriculture, Ottawa.

While the industry of Bee Keeping is fairly extensive on P. E. Island it is not nearly as large as it should be.
