PARIS CONFRONTED WITH BIG SCANDAL

PARIS, Sept. 29. (Special)—A sinister light on the life and morals of a certain section of Paris society has been shed by the tragic death of one of the best known and prettiest dancers of Paris, Pierrette Flury, aged 21, in a secluded villa in the quiet suburb of Le Vezinet. According to the revelations of the police and newspapers, terrible orgies, in which opium, ether and cocaine played a part, were enacted there nightly.

Paris is confronted with one of the leading figures of the night life of Paris. She was a statuesque brunette of striking beauty, but of often ungovernable temper. The news of her death cast a gloom over the gay haunts of Paris, whose habitués were shocked by the tragic end of one of their favorites. Pierrette died at midday. She was found dead in bed, her head wrapped in a linen sheet. She had absorbed an enormous quantity of ether and in a frenzy of intoxication had wrapped up her head in this manner. While the news of the girl's death was made public last night, her friends were informed of it earlier, and throughout yesterday a procession of automobiles bore wealthy men and women friends to the tragic villa with floral tributes, some worth hundreds of dollars. Two months ago the villa was taken over by Mme. Suzanne Dardelle, an actress well-known in Montmartre and a close friend of Pierrette, who soon joined her. The members of the domestic staff, who are all feminine, now tell stories of orgies, which lasted from nightfall to dawn, and in which Pierrette, Suzanne, and men and women who motored to the villa nightly from Paris took part.

CONVICTS, ON HONOR, TRAVEL UNGUARDED.

ALBANY, Sept. 27.—When the train from Valatie pulled into the Albany Station yesterday eight men, all but one dressed in overalls and carrying blankets, alighted. There was nothing about them to distinguish them from the ordinary foreigner travelling in this state. They were, however, establishing a record in the criminal history of the state. The eight men were convicts travelling unguarded from the state farm at Valatie to Great Meadow prison at Comstock. In a car behind them rode Warden John Mealey of the state farm. He purchased their tickets at the station and after bidding them goodspeed returned to Valatie. "I would not have come to Albany with them if it had not been for the change in cars here," said Warden Mealey after he had left the prisoners. Every man of the eight is a long term convict. Three of them have been convicted of manslaughter. There was a half hour's wait before the train to Comstock arrived. During this time the eight passengers sat on one of the benches in the depot while the warden crossed the street to purchase a cap for one of them. Warden Mealey handed the tickets to William F. O'Brien, who has served eight years for manslaughter. He was sentenced to serve 17 years, but this will be reduced to seven years because of good behavior. One elderly German and a youthful-looking Italian were the other two doing time for manslaughter.
