WILL RUN BETWEEN CANADA AND GERMAN

LONDON, Nov. 14. — George M. Bosworth, fourth Vice-President, and Archer Baker, European Manager of the Canadian Pacific Railroad Co., had a conference yesterday with Albert Ballin, the Director General of the Hamburg-American S. S. Company at which it was agreed that the Hamburg-American Steamship Company should run a first-class line of passenger steamers between Hamburg, Rotterdam and Bremen and Canada. The first sailing to Montreal will be about the latter part of March or early in April, on the re-opening of the St. Lawrence with weekly sailings during April, May and June. It is expected that the new service will result in better understanding between Germany and Canada, and will stimulate trade and divert immigrants from Germany to Canada.

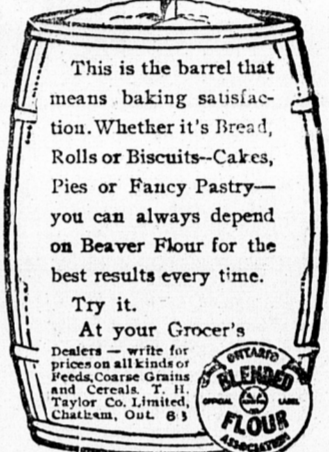

The home of Christopher Acorn of Mllive, recently was the scene of an event of more than passing interest, when a farewell party was given in honor of Seaforth Brown, the popular and efficient butter maker who has had charge of Lake Verd factory for the past three seasons and who leaves shortly for Boston. Mr. Brown was presented with an elegant dressing case, watch fob and well filled purse and replied to a very flattering address in a few well chosen words. He thanked the donors for their very beautiful gift and assured them that this night would long be remembered by him with feelings of great pleasure. After an evening spent in pleasant games and singing the guests departed satisfied that it was good to be there. The following is the address presented Mr. Brown: Dear Mr. Brown—As you are about to leave us for the neighboring Republic, we take this opportunity of giving you some tangible proof of our esteem and approval. You have by your industry and perseverance risen to a position of trust in the community and by your fidelity to duty and inflexible courtesy endeared yourself to all. You are leaving this land for another and we have no doubt that the same qualities which have pushed you to the front here will ensure your success in the country of your choice, and while we regret the loss to this province of one so well fitted to do her honor, we unite in wishing you God-speed and a full measure of success in your future home. We therefore beg you to accept this small gift as a reminder of the pleasant relations that have always existed between us and to remember that you are leaving those behind who will watch your career with interest and rejoice in your success.

AN OPEN LETTER TO PREMIER HASZARD.

Honored and Respected Sir: The importance of the subject upon which I write is a sufficient apology for addressing you in this public manner. We have on our statute books one of the best laws yet promulgated for minimizing the evils of intoxicating liquors. For that law the country is greatly indebted to us of your predecessors and every successive Liberal government has taken credit for its parentage. Such credit the majority of our electors are willing to give. The question however that now forces itself upon us is not now, when and where this bill was brought to birth but how such fostering care is the government expending over it. Is it developing into a lusty youth giving promise of a strong and vigorous manhood? We all know that a fine organism requires all the proper care and that neglect is sure to be followed by most disastrous consequences. Such consequences we are the victims of in Kings County today. Intoxicating liquors are not openly sold over bars but in this town we have a steady stream reaching the shore through two side doors—one cellar door—and one back door and perhaps also through other underground channels. Night after night our villages are disgraced by men under the influence of intoxicating liquors. Only a few nights ago this village was the scene of a brutality which all but culminated in murder. Had such been the case a great part of the blame would attach to your government. It may be asked why are not temperance workers prosecuted? The answer is simple and conclusive. Your government has given us as executors of this law an incapable prosecutor and a Stipendiary. In Southern Kings there is not an intelligent citizen who has dropped into a Prohibition Act trial but has felt the shame and disgrace attached to our court by the aimless and irrelevant questions of our public prosecutor. This was bad enough when we had an intelligent though not a very sympathetic Stipendiary. The climax of evil however has been reached when your government has seen fit to place in this high position our present Stipendiary. Would it not be better to repeal your law and make eligible for that position intelligent citizens as in Ontario and Nova Scotia and perhaps also in other provinces. Dozens of men can be found in our farming communities who would discharge the duties of that office in
