Ask Repeal Of Criminal Code

(Canadian Press)

TORONTO, Jan. 17.—Suggestion by a delegation representing the national unemployed of Canada that the question of repeal of section 98 of the criminal code would be made an issue in the next election campaign was made to Hon. Charles McCrea, Minister of Mines for Ontario and acting Premier at Parliament buildings today.

The delegation also presented a lengthy list of requests.

Mr. McCrea told the deputation there was nothing "illegal" about

the introduction of such a campaign issue and if organization represented by the delegation wanted to ask public support on the matter they were at liberty to go ahead with it.

"I am quite sure," said Mr. McCrea, "that the Government of this province will not co-operate with you as requested in any move seeking to change section 98 of the criminal code. No citizen has anything to fear under that section who is a peaceful, loyal citizen willing to abide by the laws and institutions of the country."

Included among the petitions requests were non-contributory unemployment insurance, resumption of trade with Russia, cash relief of \$5 weekly to unemployed, abolition of hostels for unemployed single men, representation of unemployed on boards dealing with unemployment problems, free light, gas and fuel, exemption of taxes and interest and the right of defaulting municipalities to self-government.

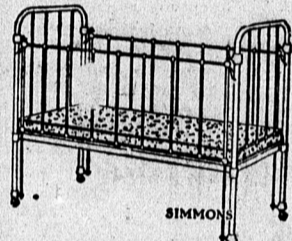
